Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of James Bush, who was allowed pension in 1833, while a resident of Clark County, Kentucky.

The data furnished herein were obtained from papers on file in pension claim, S. 1176, based upon the service of James Bush in the War of the Revolution.

James Bush was born September 26, 1759 in Culpeper County, Virginia. The names of his parents were not given.

While a resident of Orange County, Virginia, James Bush enlisted sometime in July, 1780 and served forty days as a guard at the Albemarle Barracks under Captain Davis and Colonel Taylor, in the Virginia troops. He enlisted April 1, 1781, served as private in Captain George Waugh's company, Colonel George Mathews' Virginia regiment and was discharged July 1, 1781. He enlisted August 1, 1781, served three months as private in Captain George Waugh's company, Colonel Innes' Virginia regiment, was in a skirmish near Gloucester, Virginia, and in the Siege of Yorktown.

He continued to live in Orange County, Virginia

*I ordered James Bush's pension papers. This was among them, no record of his family. You may keep this  
Sadie R. Kuhlman*

for about three years after the Revolution, then eight months in Augusta County, Virginia, then to "Holsten" in Virginia, where he lived two years, and thence to that part of Fayette County, Kentucky, which was later Clark County.

The soldier, James Bush, was allowed pension on his application executed July 23, 1833, then a resident of Clark County, Kentucky.

The papers in this claim contain no reference to the family of the soldier.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, name and address of person paid, and possibly the date of death of this pensioner, you should apply to The Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, Washington, D. C., and give the following data:

Dear Cousin Kathryn:

This could be so very important to the ISRAEL MEADOWS book. Can you please look in your file and see if you have a copy of Israel's original declaration when he applied for a pension? It should be dated September 22, 1818. That seems to be missing from the pension file in the National Archives. And I think that it must be in this original declaration that Barbara Meadows' maiden name was given as "Green". If it can't be located, the only proof we have is a letter from the Chief of Reference Division, P.C. Hamer who in 1940 wrote my mother a letter saying that her maiden name was "Green". I have the photostats of the pages of Barbara's declaration when she applied for a widow's pension. ( I believe you found your data regarding this in the DAR library at Duncan Tavern.) If you can find something that proves her maiden name, please have it Xeroxed for me and I will pay you the cost. (Just put what it costs you on the copy.)

The book is going slowly as all I have done is make a WORKING COPY (more or less an outline) around which to include extra data. Before I start writing the final copy, I must place all of the data for each child of Israel and Barbara Meadows in a separate binder. I am punching the pages and attaching them to the individual binders in order that nothing will be lost or misplaced. The second step will be to place all of the data for each child in the genealogical key with the references following each section. It's going to be a BIG book and it frightens me a little realizing that I am sixty eight years old already. I want to get the book finished while I still have my wits about me !!

Here is a little extra data for you. (I don't think I've included it in a letter before. You will forgive me, please, that I don't stop to look to see.) I keep carbon copies of ALL correspondence regarding family history.

Monroe Co., In. Index to Deeds:

- Book D -400 6 August 1834 Jesse Cole to David Hillough Bloomington Lot # 46. I'll try to look up the actual deed if I can get to spend some time at the courthouse in Bloomington. (To see if Elizabeth signed it, etc.)

One of the wonderful contacts I've made is with Hazel McCullough Lowery (Mrs. John S.) 209 Noland St., Falls Church, Va. <sup>22046</sup> She is a descendant of William and Sarah Ann (Hanson) Meadows. I'm sure she will try to contact you if she gets to Kentucky for research as planned. (The gasoline situation has us all staying closer to home, I think.)

A Mrs. Jewell Barnes, 800 Darley Dr., Lexington, Ky. 40505 has given me some Meadows data too. She says that Israel Meadows is buried on a farm (I believe in Powell Co., Ky.) that used to belong to one of her relatives. Hazel Lowery and I are trying to find out just where this is and if we can locate it, we will try to interest descendants in helping us to mark the grave. (William Meadows moved to Montgomery Co., Ky and then to Missouri !!)

I'm so in hopes you have a copy of the all important Israel Meadows declaration. *The very first one.*

*P.S. I wrote to Roscoe Meadows last summer for data. No reply to date. I would settle for just his parents' names!*
