## WILLIAM ALLEN HOUSE

*William Allen House on Goff's  
Corner-Trapp Road. Owner—

The log house built by William Allen has, until recently, withstood the ravages of time. Now no longer used as a dwelling, it is rapidly deteriorating.

This house is a point of local interest, not only as an authentic example of an early log house, but also because the builder was a son of Benjamin Allen, Jr., one of Clark County's noted pioneers.

One of the most interesting Shane manuscripts in the Draper Collection is the one containing Rev. John D. Shane's interview with Benjamin Allen of Clark County. It contains a wealth of information regarding the founding of Winchester and Clark County, one hundred seventy-five years ago.

In April, 1789, Benjamin Allen, Sr., along with his wife and family, left Berkeley County, Virginia and came to Kentucky. They settled first at Boyle's Station, about two miles west of Strode's Sation. In December, 1790, Benjamin Allen, Sr., with his son Ben, and six other hunters, set out on a hunting trip to Mud Lick Spring (Olympian Springs) in Bath County. The party became separated and the two Allens were sitting alone, by their campfire, when a number of Indians appeared in the dense cane. In their attempt to escape, Benjamin Allen, Sr. was killed and his son, Ben, then sixteen years of age, was captured. The Indians were fascinated by the lad's red hair, a probable reason for their sparing his life.

The Indians made their way north toward the Ohio River, taking their prisoner with them. On sighting some emigrants in a flat-boat on the river, the savages decided to capture it. They tied young Allen to a tree to await their return, but he somehow managed to free himself and after a harrowing trip through the wilderness, arrived safely at Boyle's Station in Clark County.<sup>28</sup>

On April 13, 1797, Benjamin Allen married Keziah Clawson, daughter of Thomas Clawson. Their children were, Thomas, John E., Benjamin, William, Richard, Rebecca, and Keziah Nancy Allen. At the time of his death in 1845, Benjamin Allen lived eight miles from the mouth of Upper Howard's Creek in Clark County.

Ann Rankin. Samuel Ellis and Thomas M. Allen, were chosen Deacons. About a year subsequent to this, Thomas Benjamin, F. Hall, P. Harris and Thomas M. Allen were ordained as ministers. In addition to them, many other Christian preachers, old and young, visited Union Church and aided in the good work of building it up. Among these were Leonard Fleming, Harrison Osborn, John Rogers, S. G. Marshall, and Michael Rice, of Kentucky, and John G. Longly, of Ohio. Many of those who had belonged to the German Reformed Church identified themselves with the Church of Christ, of whom were the Lydicks, the Sideners and the Rices. In a few years, Union Church had greatly increased in numbers and influence. Robert J. Patterson, who became a preacher of promise, and Alexander Innes, afterward in the Kentucky Legislature, were among the young members. Elder Jacob Sidener, Sr., a former member of the German Reformed Church, is still living in his ninety-fourth year, and in the thirty-fifth year of his eldership in Union Church (1881), having previously served many years as a Deacon. In the early days of this church, its ministers "preached Christ for the sake of their Master, often without pecuniary compensation, believing that the Lord would not let them suffer, if faithful in his service. If, like Paul, they could not make tents, they could farm a little, or push the plane or do some other work to sustain life, and at the same time preach the Gospel freely." In July, 1827, a young lawyer from Georgetown, was converted at Union under the preaching of Elder Thomas M. Allen, and at the suggestion of Elder Stone, and for the influence it might have on his associates, he consented to be immersed at Georgetown, his native place. This young lawyer was John A. Gano, who became a minister of the Gospel, and administered to Union Church for more than fifty years. He was licensed to preach, and extended his labors beyond his own county into Fayette and Bourbon Counties, establishing churches

and accomplishing much good. He transferred his membership to Union Church in 1828, and was regularly ordained to the Gospel ministry, November 8, of that year. Elder Stone, one of the early ministers of this church, finally removed to Illinois, and, in 1836, Elder Allen, another of its pioneer ministers, removed to Missouri. The loss of these old veterans in the service of Christ were sincerely mourned by the members of Union. The church at this time numbered over two hundred members, and the cause of religion advanced not only here but throughout the land. It would be interesting to trace the history of this venerable church minutely, but our space will not permit an extended notice. Among the ministers who preached here at intervals, besides Elder Gano, were Elders W. D. Jourdan and J. Miller, of Tennessee, William Caldwell, of Ohio, James Henshall, of Virginia, and John Smith, John T. Johnson, John G. Tompkins, Gabriel Moore, R. C. Rickets, the Rogerses, the Pinkertons, J. W. McGarvey, W. H. Hopson, Moses E. Laird (deceased), R. Graham, R. M. Gano and C. P. Williamson.

The congregation had grown to such an extent that a larger house of worship was required to accommodate its increasing numbers. A spacious brick edifice, with stone foundation was erected in 1839, 45x60 feet, at a cost to the church of \$4,000. After the completion of this building, the church prospered, and gradually increased in membership. From the organization of the church to the present time, there have been enrolled about nine hundred names upon its books, many of whom have gone to the reward prepared for the finally faithful, while others have moved away, and others still have fallen by the wayside. All six of the original members have died in the faith, and "full of years and full of honors." Of the first one hundred and twenty members added to the church, only five are now known to be living, and only three are at present members of

Union, viz. : Jacob Sidener, Sr., John A. Gano, Sr., and wife, Mary C. Gano—the other two, whose membership has been renewed elsewhere, are Mrs. Sally Russell and Mrs. Lucy Bedford. Elder Gano, the faithful old soldier of the cross, is still preaching for the church in the fifty-fourth year of his ministry there. He is the only preacher living of all those associated with Stone, Allen, Palmer, Rice and others of the early period of the church's history. Union Church, now in her fifty-ninth year, has been the mother of churches—Antioch and Newtown Churches draining a large part of their membership from it, while many have removed to other States, and to other portions of this State, so that at present the church has but about one hundred and seventy-five members. A new church building was erected in the year 1874-75, at a cost of \$4,500, and is a large and well arranged edifice.

Wood & Young were the architects, and did credit to themselves in the handsome design of the building.

There are several colored churches and schools in Dog Fennel Precinct. At Maddex Town, a colored village, they have a school and church, the latter built about 1875. The school is taught in the church. Warrentown is also a colored village on Paris pike, one and one-half miles from Lexington. It has a school but no church. There is a colored church on the Newtown pike, eight miles from Lexington, called "Brier Hill." These churches and schools are well attended by the colored people and their children.

Something over one-half of the farm connected with the Eastern Lunatic Asylum lies in Dog Fennel Precinct. But as this great public charity is particularly noticed in the history of Lexington, it will not be repeated here.—*Perrin.*

ALLEN FAMILY WRITTEN TO JOHN D. ALLEN

(Written August 1st, 1895 by J.F. Lander)

The progenitor of our branch of the Allen family in America was William whose father, Robert Allen, a Ruling Elder in the Presbyterian Church, and father, by one wife, of twenty-three children, lived near the city of Larn, in the County of Antrim, Ireland; and that house is said to be in the Allen family to this day.

William was born in 1711, and died in 1799; came to this country when he was eighteen years old; married and settled in Virginia on the south branch of the Potomac. (Loudoun County) He married three times. By his first wife he had one daughter, Jane, who married Ephraim Herriott, hence our relation to the Herriott family. By his second wife, he had eight children, five sons and three daughters. His youngest son by this wife was Joseph, my grandfather. By his third wife he had three children, two daughters and one son, James, who became the father of an interesting family of children, three of whom I will speak of later.

Grandfather, Joseph Allen (your great-great-grandfather) was born in Virginia, on the south branch of the Potomac, April 20th 1764, and died March 1st 1843. He married Fanny Wright, of a wealthy and distinguished native American family of Virginia in 1787, and came to Kentucky and settled in Clark County on the classic waters of Donaldson Creek.

Grandfather was a tall and slender man, florid complexion, and hair white as cotton, from the first I knew of him. A staunch and devoted Presbyterian; never missed having family prayers, and I have

knelt on such occasions asleep on foot! I believe Grandmother Allen was one of the best women I ever knew. How I enjoyed, as a little boy, standing and looking into her precious face as she sat and smoked her pipe. She was born January 6th, 1766 and died November 17th, 1843. They were Married August 10th, 1787, and had born unto them ten children, eight sons and two daughters, all except one lived to raise pretty large families.

The oldest child was my mother, Margaret, known to the day of her death as "Peggy". She was born in 1788, married in 1807, and died while on a visit to Indiana in 1833. There were born to her eight children that lived to marry and raise large families, five daughters and three sons, viz: Levena, Charles Fielding, Joseph Allen, Sallie Ann. John Franklin, Fannie Catherine and Rebecca Louise. Three of us are living to date, besides myself, sisters, Fanny and Rebecca.

The next was Uncle William, born 1790. Was a soldier in the War of 1812 and was in the deadly charge under Dick Johnson, when he killed Tecumseh. Uncle Billy was twice married, first to Julia Skillman, by whom he had five children, viz: Kitty Ann, Isaac Newton, Washington, Adelaide, and Christopher.

The next is John, killed when a young man by the falling of a tree, born 1792.

The next was Uncle David (your grandfather) born 1794. He was twice married, first to Susan Thompson, by whom he had four children, viz: Thompson, Alfred, Martha and Henry. His second wife was Priscilla Neff of Harrison County. (I was at the wedding) by whom he had four daughters, viz: Levena, Adelaid, Elizabeth and Amanda.

The next was Uncle Bobbie (Robert) born 1797, died September 30th, 1866. He married Polly Allison. Some of their children were Zerilda, Armilda, Matilda, Tandy and I think one or two younger.

The next was Uncle Douglas, born 1799. He married Annie Allison. I don't know the names of his children or how many he had. He moved at an early day to Indiana, and thence to Iowa.

The next was Uncle James, born 1802, married twice. First to Sally Gilkey, by whom he had two children, Edgar and William. He next married Peggy Bratton, by whom he had five children, viz: Sally Ann, Melissa, Elizabeth, Louisa and Robert Wright.

The next was Aunt Louisa, born 1804, and twice married. First to George Morris, by whom she had two children, Sarah Frances and William Andrew. Her second husband was James Boardman. They had one son, Jimmie, they lived in Indiana.

The next was Uncle Wright, born 1807, twice married, first to Frances Arnold, by whom he had two children, viz: Martha and Francis. His second wife was Polly Arnold, sister to his first. They had some children, two sons I remember, Dillard and Dunlap. Dillard was a Cumberland Presbyterian preacher.

The next was Uncle ~~Joseph born-1800~~ of Green Castle, Indiana. He may be living yet. Born 1812. He was twice married. First to Paulina Gilkey, by whom he had several children, viz: Mary, James, Artemus, Margaret and I think another or two. His last wife was Sarah Allen (no kin) married her in Indiana. They had several children, I never knew them, some of them were said to be highly educated and quiet smart.

And thus ends the chapter of our branch of the Allen family. I was always proud of my Allen kin. They were all good, staunch

Presbyterian. Uncle Billy and Aunt Louisa, however were Method-ists. They were all strong temperence people. There was not a "black sheep" among them and their descendants, so far as known to me, having been and are nice, honorable, highly respected people. I never was ashamed of any of my Allen kin.

Grandfather Allen has a brother David, who lived near him in Clark County, who raised a very nice family of eight children, five sons and three daughters, viz: "Peggy" who married a Spurgeon; Elizabeth, who married a Skillman; Asa, who married a Dooley, a Berry and Morgan (3); Alfred, who married a Thomas; Harrison, who married an Owen; Iva who married a Clinkenbeard; and David who married a Talbert, a Berry and a widow, Weigh. They all raised families, so you see how extensive the kin. Some in Kentucky, some in Indiana, some in Missouri, some in Illinois, some in Iowa and I don't know where else.

Then the youngest son of our progeniture- James Allen, half-brother of grandfather, raised a family of children. They were somewhat wealthy, continued to live in Virginia for many years. I knew three of his sons, Dr. William Allen of Tennessee; David and Samuel C. Allen of Illinois, nice highly educated men, and born gentlemen.

This record you may not now appreciate, but you will later on. Keep it and show it to your children.

- "R"---RETURN postage. (ALWAYS include a SASE.)
