I have yet to check Spotsylvania Co Va for Palmes but that's next on my list. I've been involved in my mother's family for the past few months. It's a mess. Family folklore has yet to agree with the records. It's very confusing.

I meant to ask you about something. How did you trace Joseph's children? Have you ever went to the DAR for his name. I understand you can. That might clear up a lot of information.

I also thought I might check the church's French records for Locket & Michaux. I might be able to trace John Woodson in England the same way.

I would like to have copies of what you already have on the Moxtons, Michaux, Locket, Quin, Woodson etc. I'll gladly bend you money to cover this as I know it adds up. I don't want to redo what you have, just find more.

Thank you for all of your help on these families. I will let you know how I come out on Joseph Palmer.

I don't know how you correct the DAR file but I agree it should be done. Maybe a copy of the will needs to be written. I'm not sure but someone in your chapter should know how to do it. I can't do it as it's not my line it's my husband's.

I doubt we will ever find Joseph Palmer & Elizabeth Angillo's marriage. They would have been married in Spotsylvania Co before 1781. The marriage records don't begin until 1795. That makes it difficult unless we could find the church records we could maybe find it.

I have read Radford McBurg's Rev War Pension. He is buried on the Simms farm SW of Sturgeon Mo. The cemetery is almost totally destroyed. I have not been up to it.

Abstracts from Clark County Circuit Court Records No. 743

Robert Angel and Patsey his wife, and Beverley Hambleton and Talitha his wife vs. Sarah Perkins, Administratrix of Estate of William Perkins, deceased and Samuel Morton. Petition filed March 1, 1826, alleges maladministration of estate. Answer of Sarah Perkins, dated August 10, 1826; She states that her husband William Perkins departed this life of Sept. 26, 1807, and not in the year 1808 as stated in the complainant's bill.

Deposition of Archibald Tanner, taken at the law office of Richard French in the Town of Winchester, Jan. 20, 1827; States that Sarah Perkins, widow of William Perkins, deceased, is the daughter of Samuel Morton as he has always understood and that Perkins and Morton lived on the same tract of land containing perhaps 117 acres or thereabouts. He also states that at the time William Perkins died he had a large family of children and he supposes they were all under the age of 21 years.

Deposition taken of Elizabeth Morton at the law office of Clark and Hockaday, March 20, 1827; States that in the lifetime of William Perkins deceased she frequently heard said Perkins say that the negroes which he had of his father-in-law, Samuel Morton should be returned when the money was paid back, etc. She also states that she heard said William Perkins say that he had obtained the land on which Morton lives under the encumbrance of the claims of Richard and Archer Morton and that said Samuel Morton should-be-retained-when-the-money was to have peaceable possession of the same during his life. She also states that Sarah Perkins has had nine children of her own, the oldest of which was not twelve when her husband died. She further states that she is the widow of Archibald Morton deceased, who was the son of the said Samuel Morton, and that she imagines at his death she shall come in as an heir to his estate and for one child's part, but upon reflection she thinks her husband sold his interest to William Perkins and therefore she is not interested in the outcome of suit.

She also states that the children of Sarah Perkins (after her husband's death) did all the work it is customary for children to do on the farm. The two boys, Henry and William did out work on the farm such as plowing and the girls did all such work as sowing, weaving and washing and the like.

Summons issued March 1, 1826 by Samuel M. Taylor, Clerk of the Clark Circuit Court for Sarah Perkins, Administratrix and widow of Wm. Perkins decd., David Brandenburgh, Samuel Morton, Lewis Carey and Elizabeth his wife, late Elizabeth Perkins, Sophia Perkins, William Burrus and Philadelphia his wife, late Phil. Perkins, Henry Perkins and William Perkins, the last named one of whom is an infant under the age of 21 years, children and heirs at law of Wm. Perkins, decd, to appear in the Clark Circuit Court to answer a bill in Chancery filed against them by Robert Angel and Patsey his wife and Beverley Hambleton and Talitha his wife.

Copy of appraisement of estate of Wm. Perkins deceased made Oct. 15, 1808 and filed with papers in suit: Three negro women Daphney, Linn and Peg and a small boy named Abel and a small girl named Jane held by the administratrix of said decedent during the natural life of Philadelphia Morton the mother of said administratrix as per bill of sale, Samuel Morton to William Perkins deceased.....\$266.67.

I feel certain we could locate Joseph Palmer and Elizabeth Langston's marriage, if we knew what parish they lived in. In Joseph's Rev War papers it says he lived in King George Co Va when he enlisted and then in Spotsylvania Co during the war. King George Co's marriage records don't begin until 1786 & Spotsylvania Co's don't begin until 1795. I'm sure their marriage would be recorded at the parish in one of these two counties. I have written to Northumberland Co & York Co just in case Elizabeth Langston was from one of them.

It is strange that none of these marriages can be found -
Joseph & Elizabeth (Langston) Palmer - his parents Rawleigh and ~~Ann~~ Palmer - his parents Joseph and Ann Palmer - his parents Robert and Prudence Palmer. I cannot understand why their marriages are not recorded in Northampton

Parish when their birth and death are. It is possible they were unmarried in another County or maybe in England. I'm trying Northumberland Co but I'm not sure ever that will pan out.

I went for copies of Samuel Morton's Rev War papers. They were really interesting. I also got a copy of his will. I was thrilled with it. I've sent for a copy of Philip Wades Will as well as Richard Morton. I haven't heard from either as yet when the war record and will came my husband was even interested. That's very unusual.

Where did Thomas Morton die? I want to get a copy of his will and the inventory of his estate if possible. This is getting to be more fun all of the time.

Thanks again for your help. I would never have found my Stones and Croothwaits without you.

January term 1800, held Jany. 7, 1800.

On the motion of Anthony Kindall Lewis Stephens was appointed surveyor of the road from the town of Falmouth to the Harrison line on a direction to the broad ford and that Thomas Lancistor & Anthony Kindall set apart the hands to work on the same which hands are not in the futer to be called to work on the road in the south side of the south fork of Licking.

Ordered that Aron Adams be appointed surveyor of the road leading by William Arnold's mill as now cut out in the room of Andrew Walker former surveyor of said road as far as to where William Owlings works from.

Ordered that the Inhabitants of the town of Falmouth be exempted from working on any of the roads outside of said town.

On the petition of Hezekiah Wheeler as infant under the age of twenty-one and upwards of fourteen with the approbation of the Court made choice of James Lanier for his guardian who together with William Arnold his security entered into and acknowledged here bonds in the penalty of \$1200 conditioned as the law directs.

Ordered that Coleman Goodwin, Elijah McClanahan and James Lanier call

on the proprietors of the town of Falmouth and lay off the ground allotted for the public square and fix on the ground where the goal be set.

PUBLIC SQUARE.

This indenture made this 13th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two between the under named Trustees of the town of Falmouth in the County of Pendleton and Commonwealth of Kentucky of the one part, and James Littell, John Ewing, Jezereel Ellis, James C. Goodwin, Elijah McClanahan, George Brown, William Owens, John Thrasher and James Theobald, Gentlemen Justices of the peace for the time being and their successors in the county of Commonwealth afd. of the other part, witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one cent by the said Justices of the peace to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and forever acquit and discharge, the said Justices of the peace have granted, bargained, sold, aliened and confirmed and do by these presents grant, bargain, sell, alien and confirm unto the said Justices and their successors forever two acres of land as laid off by Commissioners in the town of Falmouth as the public square for the county afd. and bounded as follows: to wit: Beginning at the corner of Main Street and Main Cross Street (now Shelby) running with Main Cross Street to Mill Street (now Chapel) and with Mill Street so far that by running a direct line across to Main Street and with Main Street to the beginning will include the two acres. To have and to hold the said land with its appertanances to the said Justices for the time being and their successors forever; and the said trustees for themselves and their successors doth warrant and forever defend the right and title of the premises from the claim or claims of all persons whatsoever claiming by, from or under them. In testimony whereof they the said trustees hath hereunto set their hands and seals this day and year above written. Signed, sealed and delivered in presence of us, Charles Sterne, George Pickitt, Wm. Clark.

(Note: - Readers will recognize the present Courthouse square in the above description running from Main with Shelby Street to Chapel, down Chapel to an alley crossing directly to Main, thence with Main to Shelby. The County has four entrances, one on each of these streets. It is supposed that the four corners were sold off of the public square to defray the expenses of the new courthouse. We hope we shall come to that in later records.)

WILL OF JOHN ANGELL.

In the name of God, Amen, I, John Angell of Pendleton county and State of Kentucky being in perfect health of Body and may thanks be given unto God, calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend

my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such world estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner & form.

First I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Milley the whole of my possessions which I now am possessed with real and personal during her natural life.

I also give and bequeath Thomas Tillery one shilling.

I also bequeath unto Nancy Tillery's children a child's part with the rest of my children, that is to say their mother's part.

I also give and bequeath unto Lucy Angell one bed & furniture.

I also give my son, John, twenty shillings.

The rest of my estate to be Equally divided at the death of my wife between George Angell, William Angell, Frances Gill, Elizabeth Paimer, Jeaber McCargo, Molley Shutes, Milley Foster, Salley Tomling, Lucy Angell, Nelly Angell & Caty Barns.

I also give and bequeath unto Caty Barns' children Lot No. 38 in the town of Falmouth and all the rest of the property which is in the possession of William Barns which is sold and conveyed to me by said Barns to be equally divided between them all, and I do nominate and appoint George Angell and Joseph Paimer, my sole executors of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and every other former testament, wills, legacies, bequests and executors ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty-seventh day of November, 1799.
