My interest in Clark County has been aroused since you wrote me about your Balls. I was working in a library last week and picked up a Clark County Cemetery book, started to note the author's name for my reference--and it was you! Congratulations on a fine compilation. The book is beautifully done and Polyanthos is a good genealogical publisher.

I had asked you if you knew anything about a Mary Ball who was born in Clark County and became Mrs. William Wynan Mangum. At that library I felt like I found a tragic story. It began with the marriage notice from the Lexington newspaper, printed in Clift's book on KY marriages:

"William S. Ball of Woodford County to Miss Rebecca M. Webb, daughter of the late Dr. Webb of Clark County, married March 12, 1850."

Then there was the Woodford County census of 1850:

William S. Ball 22

Rebecca M. Ball 18

And then from "Old Graveyards of Clark County, Kentucky":

Rebecca M. Ball b 29 Oct 1831, d 14 Feb 1853

Wife of William S. Ball

So if Mrs. Mangum were still alive, she would be almost 130 years old, so that answered my question as to that. I really don't know if William S. Ball ever lived in Clark County or anything about his children. I suppose he married again and the "Mary King" that I had shown as his wife was really a second wife. The Virkus paragraph that I mentioned to you showed that Mary (Ball) Mangum was a daughter by the first wife, Rebecca (Webb).

I just had to let you know what a thrill it gave me to know I was corresponding with the author of a genealogical book that is a good reference work.

IN THE NAME OF GOD. AMEN

I, Thomas Baber Sen: of the county of Fluvanna, being very sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following.

FIRST and principally, I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God my creator hoping to receive Salvation through the merits of my Blessed Savior and redeemer Jesus Christ, and my body to be burried in a decent manner at the direction of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and for mu estate. I give and dispose thereof in manner and form following.

Item I hereby empower my Executors to sell as much of my estate as will pay all my just debts. Imprimis I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Baber during her life without interuption The plantation and land whereon I now live, also part of an entry of land surveyed by Thos Baber Jun'r being the part that joins me Beginning at Thomas Baber Jun. and William Pace's corner line running thence to Straggles corner on the Great Branch be the same more or less, also all the rest of my Estate, both real and personal, except the remainder part of that survey above mentioned, only that it is will and desire that my son Stanley Baber shall be maintained out of my estate so long as his leg shall continue sore, likewise the charges in cureing of his leg to be paid also out of my estate.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Standley Baber if he should be living at my wifes death the land and plantation whereon I now live ~~taxed~~ ~~and his heirs lawfully begotten~~ ~~if he should die before his mother~~ ~~and the amount of said~~ ~~rest of my estate that shall remain at my wifes death~~ ~~and the amount of~~ to him and his heirs forever, but if he should die before his mother, and leave no heirs lawfully begotten. I then leave it to be sold with all the rest of my estate that shall remain at my wifes death, and the amount of said said to be equally divided among my children then living and if any of my children should die before their mother, and leave her or heirs lawfully begotten they shall inherit their part equally.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my sons John and Obadiah the remainder of that entry above mentioned to them and there heirs forever an John paying fifteen pounds to my Estate to be divided as followeth: John to have that part lying on the hogpen fork. Obediah to have that part that lies on the Great Branch if John should choose rather to keep his fifteen pounds then have the land. I then empower my Executors to sell his part and the amount of said said to be equally divided as the rest of my estate above mentioned. Lastly I make constitute and ordain and appoint my beloved wife, John Martin and William Basket my Executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made.

THE BABER FAMILY

The Baber immigrants to the English colonies in America came from Somersetshire, England, in the Seventeenth Century. An old church near Pensford, England, was rebuilt by a Baber on his return from the Crusades. The stones and the tombs in the churchyard bear names that have been carried down through many generations in America. Over the manor house doorway is a Baber coat of arms (Chew). Some Babers have received knighthood. Others have been prominent in civic affairs. Francis Baber was Justice of the Peace at Pensford near Sutton Court, Somersetshire. His son Edward died in England before 1634 (See Strachey Family History). Many Babers patented land in the old Virginia Shires. Their descendants migrated to other parts of Virginia and hence all over the United States. An early Bruton Church Register, James City Co., Va., lists James, Thomas and William. On March 20, 1635, a Francis Baber landed in Virginia. John Baber sailed from Bristol, England before 1663. Robert Baber landed in York Co., Va., 1668.

Robert and Sarah Baber had these sons: Thomas, who patented land in Lancaster County, Virginia, with his wife, Elizabeth; John, Robert, Edward.

Thomas Baber, son of the above Thomas, obtained land in Albemarle County, part of which became Fluvanna County, Virginia. He died October, 1778. His wife, Elizabeth, died before 1891. (See Stanley Baber will). The 1782 Census of Virginia lists Elizabeth as head of family of three whites. Thomas Sr.'s will names his wife, Elizabeth, and these sons: Thomas, Jr., Stanley, John and Obadiah. (See will, page _____.)

Children of Thomas Baber, Sr. and Elizabeth:

- 1 John Baber, Jr., b. 1750 (Cen. of Va. 1782 shows he had then six children. He sold his land in Fluvanna County, Virginia, and moved to Madison Co., Ky. (Rev. Ancel's Fluvanna Co. notes)
- 2 Susannah Baber, married Tandy Wood 178__ (Fluvanna Co., Va., Records)
- 3 Thomas Baber, Jr., b. September 15, 1756, died Nov. 1819. (Ancel Notes). He served in the Revolution. He moved to Bedford Co., Va., from hence to his son, William, he deeded his land in Fluvanna Co., Nov. 30, 1818. (See deed page ____). He died Dec. 4, 1818, Bedford Co., Va. Rev.
