

Stanley Baker's first land purchase was in 1794 when he bought 100 acres on waters of Four-mile creek from William O'Neal.

It is believed that the log house the ruins of which are pictured here was the home of Stanley Baker built around 1790.

Jonathan Baker the next to inhabit the house was a soldier in the war of 1812. He enlisted at Winchester, Ky Aug 15, 1813 and served as a private in Captain Samuel R Combs Co., Col. Richard M Johnson's Regiment, Ky. mounted Volunteers. He was discharged Nov 20, 1815 at Fort Meigs. He did not participate in the Battle of the Thames because he was sick in a hospital at Fort Meigs at the time. Jonathan Baker's neighbor Horatio Owen served in the same company and they were discharged at the same time and travelled home together. Jonathan later related to his family that he

had suffered an attack of DYSENTERY  
while on the road. He always declared  
that he would not have made it  
home had not his friend "Rash" carried  
him ~~part of the way~~ <sup>for many miles of the way</sup>.

Jonathan Baber married in Feb. 1815,  
Melinda Norton daughter of James  
Norton. James Norton was standing  
~~by the side of~~ <sup>near</sup> Daniel Boone when  
Boone's son, Israel, was mortally  
wounded by the Indians. One  
witness reported hearing Norton shout,  
"my God, Don't let Israel die."

Jonathan and Melinda Norton  
Baber were parents of 11 children  
Stanley, Pleasant, Thomas W. James  
John, Frank, Lucy, Sallie, Belle  
Mary and Cynthia Baber.

On Nov 4, 1850 while residing  
in Clark Co. of Va. applied for the bounty  
of land which was due on account of  
his service in the war of 1812.  
He was granted 40 acres of bounty  
land on warrant no. 3427  
under the Act of Sept. 28, 1850,  
on May 22, 1855 this Veteran  
applied for the additional

bounty land which was due  
him and was granted 120  
acres of land on warrant no.  
80102. under the act of March  
3, 1855.

Jonathan Baker was allowed  
pension on his application executed  
March 27, 1871 while residing in  
Clark County at the home of James  
Bybee seven miles from Winchester  
J. B. died intestate and is believed  
to have been buried in the family  
cemetery near the old log house, not far  
from the Doyle cfm.

Thank you very much for your nice letter and the copies of the page from your book, Old Homes and Landmarks of Clark Co, Ky. I discovered this book at the Los Angeles Public Library last spring. The LA Public Library has quite a good genealogical room. From your book I learned quite a bit about my ancestor, John Martin.

I would like copies of the wills of Obadiah Baber and the two John Gordons. I enclose a check for \$7.50 for the 3.

Since you say you are interested in my line of descent from the pioneer families of Clark Co., I am enclosing a copy of a chart that shows how. My father's mother was a Baber.

Since you seem to know so much about the local history and early families, maybe you could help me: I do not know the birthplace or parents of my 2nd great great grandmother, Luan L. Hampton who married Randall Gordon Baber. She was born 17 May 1817, I'd guess probably in Kentucky. She was married to Randall Baber 28 Nov 1833 in Clark Co. She died 24 Sept 1860 in Missouri, probably Platte Co.

At the LA Public Library I found Records of Marriages in Clark Co Ky 1792-1851 and their marriage there is listed as having occurred in 1832. I notice scads of Hamptons so guess they were a large family.

I also enclose a dollar for the postage for mailing the wills.

My papers go through the Thompsons back to where Keziah Hart, daughter of Nathaniel Hart, married Lt. Col. Lawrence Thompson. Of course this is not the only reason I wanted the information, as I needed it for my own personal research project. I have been researching all my family ancestors for the past four or five years. It is very slow and discouraging at times. It seems most of my ancestors came to Kentucky and settled in Clark, Madison and Fayette Counties. Also my Husbands Family is from Madison County.

LAST OF THE "FATHERS"

Of all those Missourians who assembled at St. Louis in 1820 and drafted the first constitution of this State, it fell to the lot of Hiram H. Baber to become the last surviving member of that pioneer convention. Had he lived but two years longer than 1873, the year of his death, it might have been said of him that his life spanned the constitutional history of the State, for the present constitution of Missouri was adopted in 1875. *The Missouri Historical Review*

As the last of the original "Fathers" of the State, Baber's biography is not without interest. He was born in Buckingham county, Virginia, on September 10, 1795, but was reared and educated in Kentucky. He came to Missouri in May, 1815, and for a time lived at Ste. Genevieve, later moving to St. Louis. In the spring of 1817 he moved to St. Charles, from which county he was elected a delegate to the first constitutional convention. Baber was twenty-five years old at the time. *Vol 28 p. 300 #4, July 1934*

From St. Charles, Baber moved to Callaway county in the fall of 1823 and to Jefferson City in 1825, where he made his home until his death on October 23, 1873.

Baber held a number of offices in Missouri. He was deputy United States Marshal in 1820; Auditor of Public Accounts for Missouri, 1837-1845; appointed United States Marshal in 1852; appointed county judge of Cole county in 1866, and re-elected to the latter position at the next election.

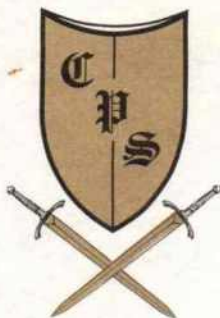
I have learned that my
