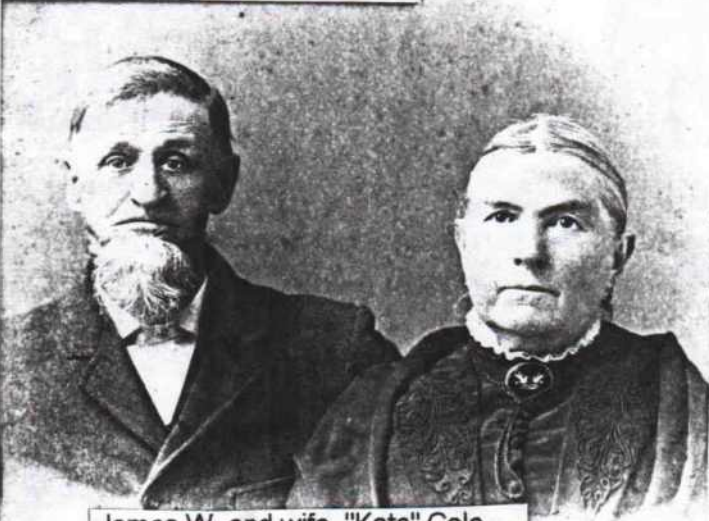

Dear Ms Owen,

Thank you for your letter of 5 September with all the information included. You are certainly very kind to me to take time to look up so many things. Now that you have told me, I will believe that there is no probate for Elza in Clark Co. I knew it was doubtful, but almost anything is possible, as I'm sure you know. You are absolutely right that the last Elza deed (I own them all and just ordered all the Phillip ones and a few more) was 1851, which, of course, fits perfectly with the Brown Co, IL deed of 1852.

Also, it means a lot to me to hear you say, "It seems almost certain that Elza and Franky are his (James Z's) parents." Yes, I think it would be odd, indeed, if it were otherwise. I was saying to a friend, "if I was researching another member of ~~xxxx~~ this family and I came across the "hole" in the 1850 census and then came across the Brown County deeds with James, I'd certainly put him in his place in the family without any hesitation." I would like to have a piece of proof that says, "...to my loving son..." or something like that but that may never be found. Only an "accident" like someone like me looking on the Illinois end of the family would have been able to put all this together.

I will keep writing and keep you posted on what the Phillip deeds tell, but meantime I have included a small check just to say thank you for your help so far. I hope you will accept this small token for your help and buy ~~xxxx~~ something you need or want. I wish it could be more, I owe you much more!

I have also included a photo of myself, which looks pretty much like me except my hair is not nearly as red as in this picture. This so you can see what a "Ballard from Clark County, Ky." looks like. I am quite proud to be from Clark County and descend from Phillip, who I believe is from one of the finest families in VA.

In 1850, while the rest of the family was in Clark Co, Kentucky, JAMES BALLARD was in Brown Co, IL working for George Winslow. In a deed not listed here JAMES bought the E½ of the NW¼ of section 1 of Buckhorn Township in 1851. In 1852 JAMES sold the land to his father, ELZA, and mother, FRANKY, who had brought the entire family, except Henry, with them from Kentucky. In 1855 apparently ELZA died and the estate was split legally, though no probate has been located. The 1855 deed is the siblings of JAMES selling their share of the estate to him. In 1856 James moved to Scott Co, IL and married KIZIAH SAPPINGTON. Meantime JAMES' mother FRANKY stayed on the land in Buckhorn until James returned to Brown County in 1864. With the 1864 deed Shelton, his wife and his mother, FRANKY, sold their share of the estate to James, who lived on the land till his death in 1894. His son Eddy bought the land from Kiziah and lived there till 1904.

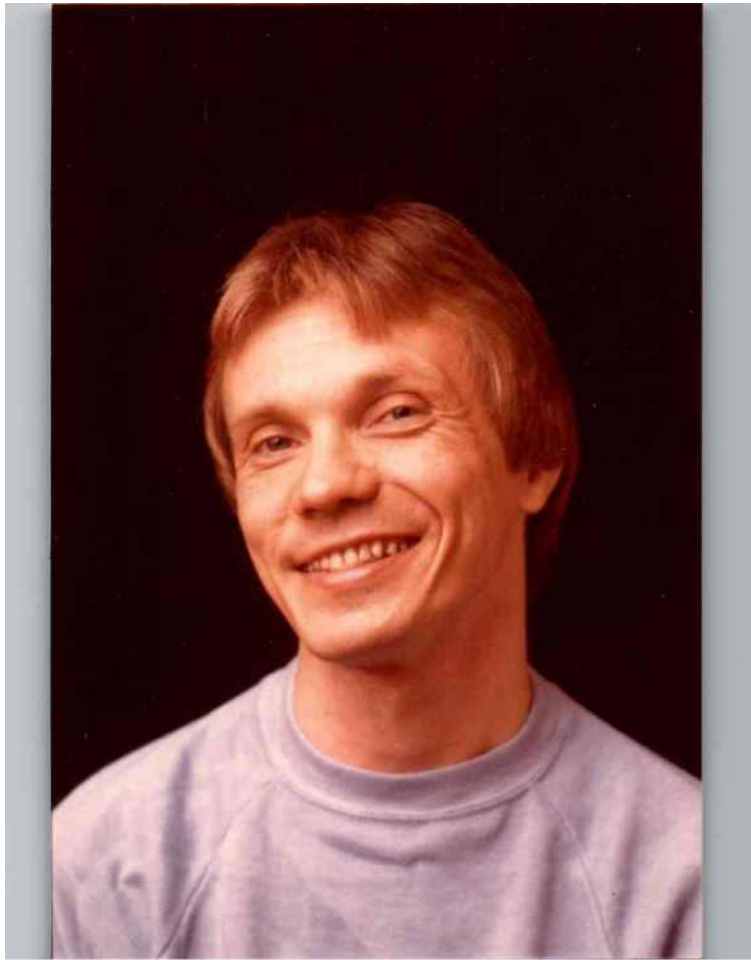
The Hamboe line comes to me thru my great grandfather John W. Ballard II mar. Harriett Hamboe. John was father to Samuel Ballard.



in the year 1832 personally appeared in open court

the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup>  
1839

REV. WAR PENSION APPLICATION  
JOSEPH PALMER, SR. - CLARK CO, KY

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated. — He enlisted in a company commanded by Capt. Buchanan for the term of twelve months, and served out his said term. The first name of Buchanan he cannot recollect, if he ever heard it. — He was marched first to a place called Dangerfield in Spottsylvania County Virginia — from there he was marched to Williamsburg — from there to Springfield, where they were quartered a considerable time — from there to Hampton where he remained until his said term of enlistment had expired and he was discharged. — He cannot recollect the number of the regiment to which he belonged but it was commanded by Col. Johnson. His discharge was signed by Major Buchanan. (being the same officer who had been his Capt. but who had been promoted) He has lost said discharge many years since. — When he enlisted he resided in King George County State of Virginia.

He cannot recollect the time when he enlisted. He  
thinks however it was in the year 1776. He  
was not again in the service until the year  
1781. when he entered it as a militia man. He  
was drafted in a company commanded by  
Captain Coleman. He was marched to Fred-  
ericksburg, where the Virginia Militia were un-  
der the command of General Weedon. From  
there he was marched under Weedon <sup>but pepper</sup> to  
County where they were met, or where they fell  
in with the Marquis La Fayette, and the  
men he commanded. Weedon then left us.  
and we marched on until we were joined

by General Wayne, <sup>with his troops</sup> - upon the  
junction with Wayne we ~~marched to~~ ~~Richmond~~  
~~above it~~ ~~Richmond~~, marched towards Albemarle  
old Court house, and shortly afterwards the  
British army commenced its retreat, in the  
direction of Richmond and we followed  
until we reached Goochland County - The  
British retreated from Richmond to Williams  
burgh, and our army followed through  
and near Richmond, and from that  
in the direction of Williamsburgh passing  
New Kent Court house, until the army  
stopped at some old fields, where he was
