Dear Ms Owen,

I spoke to Mrs Couey and I assume that she has mentioned to you that I need more help in Winchester. For about 6 months or longer I have had no time to do my own research. I have been busy with my regular profession as an Art Director, but have also begun doing professional genealogical research here in NYC.

So, finally, I am again able to turn to my Ballards. I was hoping to be lucky and without unturning every stone in Clark Co link my Phillip Ballard with a Virginia branch of the family, but I have so far been unable to do that. So, I have begun a systematic reconstruction of the families of all the Ballards in Clark County early.

I have established clearly that John b:1785 and William who married Jane were sons of my Phillip. James, who was about the same age as Phillip, is, I believe, his brother, but I have yet to really prove that. In any case --through the census-- I have proven that the James in the 1810 Clark Co, KY census must be the one in the 1820 Montgomery Co census. This James moved back to Clark Co in 1830 and it seems moved back to Montgomery Co in 1840. I have yet to check him out in 1850.

I wondered if you are available for research. I will give you an idea of what I am interested in and send you a check hoping that you can help. If you can't, please let me know as soon as you can.

I will list the wills I want that I know specifically about below, but I want copies of all the BALLARD wills and ADM's up to 1900. I am especially interested in seeing a copy of my direct ancestor's will:

PHILLIP BALLARD 1824 Book 5 pp 424, 405, 422, 448.

According to all accounts of this will the married name of Phillip's daughter SUSAN cannot be read. I would like a copy of the original myself, but I would also like you to try to read the original. If you cannot read it, and in ANY CASE, I would like you to look up the Probate Journals regarding this will and copy the references to it. Among other things, the will should have been recorded as it was read, into the Journal.



Dear Ms Owen:

I was happy to find your letter of 21 September in the box yesterday. You do me an honor by complimenting me on my appearance. Thank you. I guess I sound a lot older than I am, however I am 42...am I middle aged...ha,ha,ha?

I hope that you are able to find out more on Horace Moses. Did I send you enough stamps?

I am glad that you kept the check and will put it to good (or fun) use. I would have been hurt if you'd have returned it. I know that you enjoy helping me, but there is the simple fact that few (or no) other person could help me quite as you can and even if they could it would cost me money. I hope you will accept a gift from me from time to time in the spirit of me thinking of you as the HONORED HISTORIAN of Clark County, Kentucky. In this way there is no pressure on you to do what you feel you can't do or don't have time to do, but I think that many of the things that you just simply have stored in your head (especially about the records at the courthouse) and are so easily available to you in that way, save me a great deal of time and searching.

I am still waiting for the Fayette County tax films to arrive at our local Mormon library here, so that I can see if Elza is on the tax roll. It is curious indeed that he (or James Greening) signed no deed while in Fayette County for about 10 years. I find this quite curious. Both he and James Greening are in the 1830 Fayette Co census.

I found an Elza Ballard in your phone book, but when I wrote him my letter was returned. I wonder if he died or moved? He must be a cousin. Are there any Greening descendants that you know of in the area today. Any of Robert's children?

Are you related to Elizabeth Wills of the Kentucky Historical Society? She's a researcher and did some work for me. Yes, I wonder about the Ballards in Indiana. It seems odd to me that my family would cross Indiana into Illinois and not leave any records or family along the way. I suppose it is possible that it was made in one jump by my direct line. It seems almost certain that ELZA brought the family in one step having gotten word from son James that he had land for them to live on in Brown County, IL. Mary/Polly/Molly is a common name of the time and a common name in my Ballard family in that period.

If I am infact from the Ballards of VA, which seems quite likely, ho^wever, then even apparently the Ballard branch from NY State are cousins, according to a recent ne^w correspondent I found.*

I had not thought of the possibility of alternate speklings of the GREENING name. Could you list them for me --ones that you know^w of for sure that are relatives. What about "Green." In the one census right belo^w JAMES GREENING AND WIFE is listed a GREEN, who seems not to be related.

Yes!!!!!! Any Crosth^wait information you have I ^would like. They are as much ancestors of mine as any of the other family names, but they are such a ne^w family name to me that I have so far just begun to think about them. Perhaps they will be an easy family to trace. Please send me what you have. If you need xeroxes I will of course gladly pay for all expenses and postage. In fact, I am going to send you a small check. Even with this check it could hardly be considered more than a TOKEN for your kindness and help. I am so PROUD to be descended from PHILLIP BALLARD of CLARK COUNTY. As you know^w, I have both of Mr Bedford's books but the maps in them are too "scratchy" and difficult to read. Do you know^w of any early maps that list the 2 mile, 4 mile, Little Stoner and Stoner...also Sno^w Creek?

I have the marriage date for James and Sarah Greening but not that deed. So far I ^won no VA deeds. I ordered all the Phillip Ballard deeds from Clark Co, but no information was found that I did not already know^w. It is too bad that more deeds did not mention relationships.

Just *Incidentatly, apparently there were t^wo Ballard families in VA at the same time, though the English one was much earlier. Both had Phillips (wouldn't you know^w). One was from Scotland and ~~XXX~~ settled in Phild., the other was from England and ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ settled in VA quite early. I am no^w trying to sort out these Ballards and pry my Phillip from the bunch. Since the Greenings were in 1785 Albemarle County, I am assuming that the Phillip in Albemarle County MUST BE MINE. Wouldn't you deduce that? I think Phillip Ballard was born about 1757 (about the time James Greening was). Despite what some have said, and the mention in Mr Bedford's book, I can find no proof that my Phillip Ballard was in the Rev^w War. There is proof of another Phillip from VA, but not mine. The other Phillip died in 1836, mine died in 1824 in Clark Co. I have written Mr Bedford for his source, but someho^w I do not expect to hear from him.

"James Ballard died at his residence in Brown County Illinois on March 27, 1894. He was born in Clark County, Kentucky Oct 25, 1827, and was therefore 67 years of age. He first united with the Church during the winter of 1854 and his Christian life covered a period of 40 years. He leaves a wife and six children to mourn their loss. There are 4 sons and 2 daughters, one son and one daughter were absent from the funeral services, which were held at the family residence on Thursday, March 28, and conducted by Rev. F.P. Douglas of Mounds. The internment took place at the cemetery at Hersman."

Mrs. Kiziah Ballard, who died in Jacksonville was brought to Hersman in the nine o'clock train on Saturday morning and buried in the Hersman cemetery. The funeral services were held in the Presbyterian Church, conducted by the Rev. Mr. Peak of Exeter, assisted by Revs. Martyn of Hersman and McCoy of Mt. Sterling.

Kiziah Ballard was born near Lexington, Kentucky on December 25, 1832, and departed this life on March 16, 1911, at age 81 years 2 months and 19 days.

She was married to James Ballard on May 1, 1855, who died March 27, 1894. To this union were born 6 children, Bennett who died December 25, 1902, the remaining children are James, of Chicago, Sulvestus, of Mountain Home, Arkansas, Eddie, of Crab Orchard, Nebraska, Mrs Elva Morris, of Chapin and Mrs. Kate Hedrick of Mt. Sterling.

Mrs. Ballard lived for a good many years in Elkhorn Township, where she was well and favorably known and her family was reared. She was a devout woman and faithful to her duties as a Christain, as well as a mother. For a number of years she had been in poor health and her mental faculties had become impaired, and for the past few months had been in the hospital in Jacksonville, Ill.

All of her children, except Sulvestus, who recently removed to Arkansas, and Eddie, who lives in Nebraska, were present at the funeral services.

Dear Ms Owen,

I don't quite know where to start this letter. Your letter was forwarded to me in Indiana --Hammond-- where I was visiting my mother. From there I went to southern IL --Brown Co-- to do more research. I returned here Sunday exhausted and ill from allergies. I am trying to lay low but still do a certain amount of getting my life back on the track. Naturally I have tons of papers to file and read and stacks of mail to go thru.

I am quite indebted to you for the research you have done on my behalf. A Phillip Ballard is listed for a Rev War pension and I wrote the Govern'mt but they say it is not the one from Clark Co. I will press them further, but what you have found would give me an SAR on James Greening if Phillip proof can't be found. I found your second envelope on my return along with the much awaited books of Goff Bedford, which I had ordered about 3 months ago. Apparently Goff was gone for two months. I found the reference to Phillip but there is no proof offered. Bland is mentioned also. A researcher I respect a great deal formerly from the NYPL here has said that he thought that one of the Blands might be the father of ~~JAMES~~ Phillip. I haven't been able to follow that up yet but it is interesting that Bland was in KY and in IL. One of the Blands was given a special burial in Frankfort.

I own copies of all the Elza deeds and they tell nothing of interest. The reason I mentioned the Watts is that they married into the family. I have traced the Deharts (note the Watts and Dehart marriages to James Ballard's sisters on my chart) and interviewed one of them in Illinois. They own a bible and family records that are additional proof that Elza was in IL. I know that the Greenings --James-- were in Albermarle Co, VA when Phillip was. It seems the Johnsons, Watts and Ballards all were in KY together and in IL, I wondered if you just might know more about the Watts, but I guess what I really need to do is find a living Watts cousin. So far I have been unable to fill in the missing Ballard female, the eldest sister of my James. I tend to believe that she, like her brother Henry, stayed in KY.

With the circumstantial proof that I've found do you think I still should consider one of the two Johns as possible fathers of my James Z? It seemed to me obvious that the deeds between Elza and James and Franky and James were between close family. It is possible that James could be a nephew of Elza but wouldn't you say that that is highly unlikely. In any case, Phillip would still be my James' grandfather. I believe that the 1855 et al deed was for

the estate of Elza, but Shelton and Franky continued to live on the property and did not sell their share till 1864 when James moved back to Brown Co from Scott Co. At that time Shelton and Franky sold their part of the land to James for only \$100. As far as I know neither of the Johns in Clark Co ever came to Il, so I believe that it is not an unreasonable assumption to believe that Elza is the father of James.

The ELSEY in the Court Records must be Elza. He is occasionally listed that way in the census and tax records. Elza spent about 10 years in Fayette Co (James Greening was there too) and that is actually where James was born, which was another reason that I had gotten very confused and could not find James' father easily. It was said that James was born in Clark Co, but the truth was that he was FROM Clark Co.

I have much sorting and backup research to do yet but I think the main puzzle of James' father is solved. I wondered where you got the Greening information. Is it from Mr Bedfords books? I haven't had a chance yet to sit down with them and really get into them. I'm trying to get letters off to everyone who wrote me while I was gone, which is quite a task.

I hope you are well. I will enclose my proofs and deductions about Elza and James for you to consider. Not listed in these is the fact that Elza is found in the 1850 Clark Co census with all the children who are later found in Brown Co, of course it is unfortunate that James had already gone to Brown Co in 1850.

- Willis 43 with sone James W 22 of Nelson Co, KY....all born KY. James was 23 at the time. (THIS MUST BE YOUR JAMES W.?)
- Nancy Ballard 45 with son James W. 21...all from Madison Co, KY.... (OR IS THIS WOUR JAMES W?)

He could not be a son because Phillip died before James was born. Seems to me I remember running across James W. Ballard and Catherine Cole. Do you have all the information you want on them or are you interested in the little I might have?

There are two things that lead me to believe that my JAMES Z BALLARD was from Clark Co, KY.: 1) The death certificate of his son Morgan Bennet Ballard in Illinois says that his father was from Clark Co, KY. 2). He married Kiziah Sappington who was born in Clark Co, KY. The census reports on the family later in ILL. repeatedly say that both James & Kiziah AND their parents were born in KY.

The JOHN BALLARDS in Clark co, as I said in my first letter, are still the best ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ possibilities, except so far I have found no way to prove parenthood.
