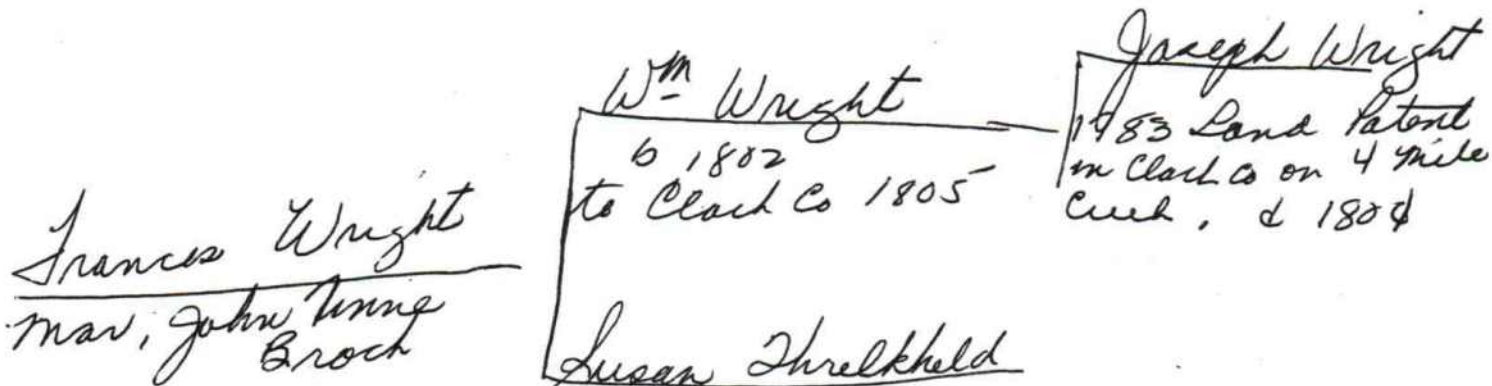
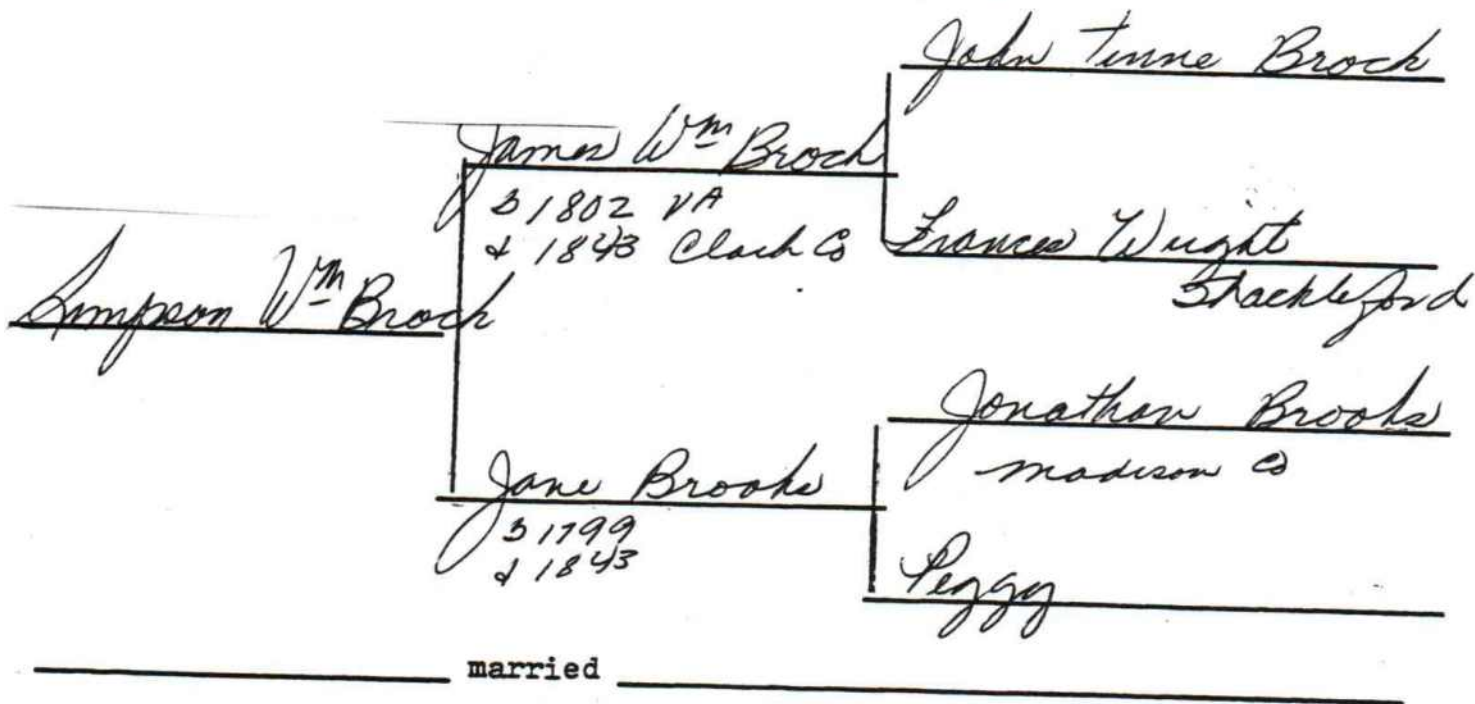

3. JAMES WILLIAM BROCK

James William Brock, son of John Tinne Brock and Frances Wright Shackelford Brock, was born on February 27, 1802, in Virginia. On October 6, 1825, he married Jane Brooks, daughter of Jonathan and Peggy Brooks, in Madison County. The father signed for her. Jane was born on December 7, 1799.

On April 17, 1826, William bought a tract of land on the Kentucky River from his parents for \$250. James Burton, Susannah Brock and Sarah Goldman were witnesses. The land adjoined that of Jeremiah Lewis, and was the tract of land that John Tinne Brock had bought at the junction of the ~~Red River and Kentucky River~~ in 1817 (D.B. 22, p. 25) On September 28, 1828, William bought for \$1200 in silver in hand" 215 acres from James Burton and his wife, Susan. The land bordered the Kentucky River, the land owned by Lewis, and that of John T. Brock. On September 13, 1839, William Brock bought for \$1500 242 3/4 acres at the ~~mouth of the Red River~~ from Wilson R. Maupin. The land adjoined that of Lewis Dumford Conkwright corner, Nancy Glover and Beach.

The William Brock household was listed in the 1830 Clark County Census, page 83, as follows: 2 males 20-30, 2 females 20-30, 2 males 0-5. Also in the household was a female slave, 24-36.

The 1840 census, p. 268, gives this data: 1 male 30-40, 1 female 30-40, 2 males 10-15, 1 female 0-5.

According to the family records, William Brock died on August 9, 1843; and Jane died a month later, September 3, 1843. They left no will, and the commissioners appointed Allen H. Cox to be administrator, August 11, 1847. William's estate was inventoried and sold on November 7, 1843, and things sold included a clock, a yoke of oxen, books and a book case. (W.B. 10, p. 291) Then a report of the sale was presented to the October Court of 1847, and after expenses the proceeds were \$1175.44. The record states, "Silas Brock, one of the distributees died under age in Mexico Jan. 1847 and we have divided his interest between his brother and sister." (W.B. 11, p. 241)

No provision had been made for the distribution of the land. The matter came before the Circuit Court, and the commissioners were appointed to divide the land and slaves between the two survivors, Simpson William Brock and Emily Jane Brock. Both were minors, under the age of twenty-one. In the September Court of 1847, the commissioners presented a sketch of the farm, lots were drawn, and the land was divided. Simpson William got the 241 acres next to the Kentucky River, and Emily Jane received the 292 acres north of that. Lots were also drawn for the two slaves, and Emily got the 18 year old girl, Lucinda, valued at \$350. Simpson got the 15 year old boy, Flemon, valued at \$475, and had to agree to pay his sister the \$125 difference. In this court case, the deceased father, William, was also called James, and therefore we assume that his full name was James William Brock. The deeds to the land were given to Simpson William and Emily on October 8, 1847. (D.B.

On December 16, 1799, John Brock and Philip Cox were executors for the will of George Thomas of Pittsylvania County. The obituary of John indicates that he came to Clark County, Kentucky, in 1802, but this is probably when he came to Pulaski County from Virginia. The son, William Brock, was born in Virginia in February 1802, and John T. Brock, Jr., was born in Pulaski County in November 1804. John Sr. is first listed in the tax records of Pulaski County in 1807, on 100 acres, and continues there through 1815. In 1813 John and Frances bought 200 acres from Isaac Muse in that county for \$400. Then, in 1821, they sold their land in Pulaski County to Reuben Gossett, a brother-in-law, and Meshack Brock, a brother.

Clark County, Kentucky, must have held an attraction for John and Frances Brock for some time before their move there. Frances' grandfather, Joseph Wright, had received a land patent from the Commonwealth of Virginia for 562 1/2 acres on Four Mile Creek in Clark County in 1783. Frances was named for her grandmother, Frances Wright. As seen above, her parents, William and Susanna Threlkeld Wright had moved to Clark County in 1805. Visits to Clark County must have been fairly common. When Joseph Wright died in 1804, an estate sale was held on October 15, and one of the purchasers of items was John Brock. (W.B. 2, page 21) When another sale was held on September 26, 1806, again John Brock bought some items. (W.B. 2, page 219) The move to Clark County probably came about 1816 when John first appears on the tax list there. On January 24, 1817, John T. Brock bought 61 acres off the 1000 acre estate of Aaron Lewis at the intersection of the Red River and the Kentucky River. (D.B. 12, page 536) Through the succeeding years, other land was purchased. On August 4, 1821, John T. Brock bought 90 acres on Bull Run from William Wright, Jr., and his wife, Nancy. The price was \$500. (D.B. 18, p. 44) On January 20, 1829, John T. Brock bought 20 acres on the Kentucky River from William Stone and his wife, Nancy. This land adjoined the 90 acres mentioned above. (D.B. 23, p. 503) On July 26, 1830, John Brock, Sr., bought 50 acres near a branch of the Kentucky River from Richard Oliver for \$100. (D.B. 24, p. 222) Then, on March 25, 1833, John Brock, Sr., and Franky, his wife, bought 25 acres adjoining John Brock, Jr., from Charles Goldman. (D.B. 26, p. 139)

John T. Brock, Sr., was listed in the Clark County Tax List for many years, beginning in 1819. A typical notation was "Brock, John, 90 acres Bull Run; 61 acres Ky. River; 1 white male over 21, 3 horses."

The 1820 Clark County Census, page 73, provides the following information on John Brock's household:

Simpson William Brock

Simpson married Elizabeth Jane Oliver. They had thirteen children:

Florence married Allen Ecton of Winchester, had about eight children: James Allen, Garland, Scott, Oliver, Mary Frances Owens, Elizabeth, Will, and A.B. Ecton.
6. W.O. Brock had four children.
Beulah married Frank White, has two children: Preston White and Anna Louise Reynolds. Harvey has five children: Tommy, Oscar, Bobby, Dorothy and Carolyn Watts. Pete has one son, William Roger (Pete). Nancy Mae married Bruce Taylor, but has one son by a former marriage, W.O. Davis. (Dorothy married a Mefford).
7. Dillard Brock lived in Minneapolis, Minnesota and had two daughters, Corda and Bessie.
8. Emma Oliver had five children: Carl, Richard, Everette, Glenmore and Lula.
9. Gussie (boy) died at the age of 19.
10. Susie died at the age of 16, burned to death.
11. Minnie Jones lived in Bloomington, Illinois. Had about five children: Myrtie, Clara Belle, Earl and Ernest.
12. Belle Pharis had no children, and was the only one living in 1947.
13. Thomas Wilkerson Brock. Died in 1925 at the age of 52. Had two daughters, Viola Faulconer and Anabel Henry.

Simpson William Brock's mother was a Brooks. He had a brother lost in the Mexican War, and a sister, Emma Wilcox, and possibly one other sister. He died August 31, 1900, at about the age of 72. He died of an infection in his foot caused by a thorn. When his wife, Elizabeth Jane Brooks, had died, Simpson married a Mrs Mary Jane Webber Bush(?), the grandmother of Dr. Bush. She died about 1913.

Elizabeth Jane Oliver Brock died at the age of 48 (when her son, Tom Brock was only 5 years old. She was sick only 3 days. She had a brother, Jim Oliver, and about three sisters. I think one of her sisters married Henry Brock, a cousin of Simpson. Their children are Claybourne, Walker, etc.

John Wilcox's father was a first cousin of Tom Brock.

There were no twins in the family and no red heads.

Notes from Obituary of Simpson W. Brock: Son of William Brock
(1802-1843), grandson of John Brock who came to this
country in the latter part of 18th century and settled
near the mouth of Red River where he lived to be nearly 90
years of age.

Simpson W. Brock was a justice of the peace, member,
steward and trustee of Dunaway Methodist Church in Clark
County.

Note: Died at his home near Reform, Callaway Co., Mo., Richard
Curtis, aged 81 years, husband of Mary Jane Brock Curtis.
He was a native of Virginia but spend his youth and young
manhood in Clark Co., Ky. Moved to Missouri, acquired con-
siderable property, much of which was lost during the Civil
War. When a young man he married a Miss Brock who died during
the war. In 1871 while on a visit to Clark Co. he married
Mary Jane Tuttle, nee Brock, a second cousin of his first
wife. For more than 60 years a member of Methodist Church

TRAGEDY IN THE BROCK FAMILY

Tragedy seemed to strike Henry Nelson Brock's family. On December 5, 1889, he and his wife Nancy Catherine (Eubank) (Benton) Brock lost their twenty year old daughter from brain fever. Then Dec. 13, 1891, Henry Nelson Brock died after a short illness. On July 30, 1892, two of their sons and four of their grandsons were drowned in the Kentucky River. It seemed, on Saturdays afternoons, for recreation, the men and boys in the immediate vicinity went to the river nearby. On this particular Saturday afternoon, July 30, 1892, there were in the party some five or six men, Henry Wright, Claiborne Brock, Asa Brock, Harvey H. Brock, Elisha Baber. It seems there were one or two more men, but I cannot recall the names. There were nine boys, ranging in age, perhaps from four to sixteen years. There were three of Henry Nelson Brock's boys, five of Jim and Alive (Brock) Farney's boys and one small Oliver boy. They went across the river in a boat to a sand bar. Henry Wright pulling the boat by a rope and Claiborne Brock pushing the boat, both Men wading; you will remember that far back we didn't have locks and dams in Kentucky River. There were many shallow places and fords. After they waded and splashed, and had a good time, the men decided it was time to go home. They started to put all the boys in the boat but Asa Brock said, "No, I told Jim Farney I would take care of Gordon and I will take him when I go." Evidently Asa Brock had taken little Gordon Farney over when he went over. Henry Wright and Claiborne Brock started wading back across the river, pulling and pushing the boat, just as they did going over. They thought they were wading back the same direction or way they had waded over but evidently the boat had drifted a little, or something unexplainable had happened for both men stepped into water over their heads. The children got excited and stood up in the boat- the men on the bank yelled for them to sit down. They ran to the end of the boat and the boat turned upside down, throwing them all into the water. Henry Wright was the only man in the crowd who could swim; he got the little Oliver boy out onto the bank. Then Henry Wright was so weak and I suppose so shocked that he couldn't go back into the water to try to save any of the others. Claiborne Brock came up close to the boat and caught hold of the edge of the overturned boat. His brother Walker Brock went down 3 times- later he said each time when his feet touched the bottom of the river he tried to spring as high as he could to get air. The third time he came up close enough for Claiborne Brock to grasp him by the finger tips and pull him toward him. Walker grabbed Claiborne around the neck- the men fearing he would drown both of them yelled to him to grab him around the waist. Walker did and they both clung to the edge of the upturned boat. The men saw the water was going to suck them under the boat so they yelled to them to climb on top of the boat and they would get them out. None of the men ever got the strength to get them out so Claiborne and Walker lay across the bottom of the upturned boat until Claiborne finally got strength to paddle the boat to the bank with his hands.

Of the nine boys only Walker Brock, the little Oliver boy and Gordon Farney escaped death. The last of the six bodies were recovered late that night. Asa Brock lived at the old homeplace, John Tinne' Brock's home--that home was larger than any of the other family homes so Asa Brock said, "these children have all lived together, they have all died together and they are not going to be separated now"- so all six bodies were taken to Asa Brock's home. A Mr. Michaelberry Powell

(Pronounced like it was spelled Mikelberry) lived in the community and made coffins. He made 3 coffins for the six bodies; one for the two Brock boys, Algin and Winther, two for the four Farney boys whose names were Kelley Farney aged 13, Claude Farney, age 11, Walter Farney age 10 and Charley Farney age 8.

On the Saturday that this happened, my mother-in-law, Nancy Catherine Brock had gone to her daughter's home, several miles distant to spend the week-end with the daughter Ann Eliza (Brock) Bush, who was in bed with a new born son. When the mother arrived Ann Eliza said, "Ma, where are the boys?" Mother said, "they wanted to come but I thought it would be better for them to come next weekend." About night fall two boys on horse back rode to the stileblocks and called for Enoch Bush, Ann Eliza's husband, who went out in the yard and talked to them for quite sometime. Finally he came in and said, "Ma, the boys want to talk to you." So she went to talk with them.

She said she was so terribly grieved that she had to sit down on the ground and wait until she could control her emotions before she went back into the house. Her daughter was frail anyway and she just didn't know how best to break the news to her but she knew she had to do it. Finally she went in and told her that her sister Alice's four boys were drowned. Ann Eliza said, "Oh poor Alice, how terrible." Mother said, "Yes, and your two little brothers are gone too." Ann Eliza almost collapsed.

The two boys who came on horseback to bring the sad news were waiting in the yard for mother. When things were a little more settled or calmer Mother got on her horse and went with the boys to Asa Brock's home (Grandfather's old home) where the bodies had been taken. Of course all the families concerned were there, as well as many friends and neighbors.

At the river, when the children and Henry Wright and Claiborne went under the water, Claiborne was under water so long that the men on the bank thought he was drowned. Later Claiborne said some of the children had held his feet and some grabbed him around the neck. Of course he didn't know which ones they were, they were all his loved ones, he thought they would all be drowned and the thought came to him-"if they all drown and I stay here and drown, there won't be anyone left to take care of Ma so he kicked his feet loose and pulled the arms from around his neck that was when he came up and grasped the edge of the upturned boat.

That night Claiborne came and got down on his knees beside his mother and said, "Ma do you blame me for kicking loose from the children?" and Mother said no she didn't blame him, she felt he did the very best he could.

There were more than a thousand persons came to grandfather's old home to see the six children laid out in one house. They had one funeral and were all buried in the Brock graveyard nearby.

I have written this just as my mother-in-law, Henry Nelson Brock's widow told it to me- signed Mrs. Julia S. Hastings Brock, wife of Claiborne Brock. P.O. Box 15 Winchester, Ky.


