Dear Miss Owen:

Thank you for your letter of October 25., offering to do research for me. I would very much like to have this work done, and especially interested in the will of Stephen Brockman (Hoping to find correct list of his children, etc). Stephen came to Kentucky from Orange County, Va., where his parents John and Elizabeth Burris Brockman lived. He and Elizabeth Embree were married there, according to the findings of W. E. Brockman, of Minneapolis, Minn., who has written several books on the Brockman family. Mr. W.E.Brockman, a distant cousin, is descended from Stephen's brother, and therefore hadn't pursued tracing descendants of Stephen, as he had Stephen's forbears. (I am attempting to do this.)

No doubt the Joseph Embree who deeded land to Elizabeth Embree was her father (or grandfather). He would be my 4th great grandfather. This would account for 2nd great grandfather's name, Joseph Embree Brockman. So I would be interested in his 1815 will, also, as it would seem to give her children. The Joseph E. Brockman will made in 1826, could be my 2 g. g.father. It was soon after that, he left Kentucky for Missouri, and in 1850 came to California from Missouri. I have found no record of any will for him here, although he died in Sonoma County, California, in 1890. John Brockman made his will (father of Stephen) in Orange County, Va., & it is printed in one of W. E. Brockman's books, which I have.

I am hoping you can find something on Joseph Embree Brockman's wife, Mary Jane Culbertson. She was born 20 March, 1801, "near Lexington." Nothing is known of her parents (by our family) other than her mother was "from Maryland" and her father was a Scottish sailor. Joseph E.B. was born 1 June, 1805 in Carter County, Ky, according to our family records, and this couple was married January 1, 1824. Their two oldest children were born in Carter County, but the third was born in Missouri in Feb. of 1828. I haven't had access to any Kentucky census records.

I am enclosing the \$5. you requested. I am thankful that the librarian at Winchester handed my letter on to you.

Dear Sir:

Can you give me some information? I am compiling a record of my forbears who lived in Clark County, Kentucky, around 1800. I am told the official records for that period were destroyed by fire.

My ancestors, Stephen and Elizabeth (Embree) Brockman, looked after property belonging to his father, John Brockman, in Clark County. They had several children, among them my director forbear, ^{son: Joseph Embree} ^{m: Bond 1803 May 31} ~~Joseph Embree Brockman~~ who was born in Clark County 1 June, 1805. ~~Joseph~~ married Mary Jane Culbertson born 20 March, 1801, on ~~January 1, 1824~~. She is a native of Kentucky also--probably Clark County. Joseph and Mary's two oldest children were born in Clark County, Israel and Asa. This couple moved to Missouri about 1827 or 1828, and from there to California in 1850.

Our family record has no information on the parentage of ~~Mary Jane Culbertson~~, other than her mother "was from Maryland and her father a Scottish sailor." I am very anxious to learn who her parents and brothers and sisters, if any, were. I am also searching for a complete and accurate list of the children of Stephen and Elizabeth Brockman.

I will greatly appreciate any information or suggestions you can give me.

Joseph E. Brockman and wife to Harmon F. Culbertson

Indenture made 15th day of September, 1826 between Joseph E. Brockman and Mary Jane his wife, late Mary Jane Culbertson of County of Clark and State of Kentucky, of 1st part and Harmon F. Culbertson of County of Clark and State aforesaid of other part. For sum of \$70.00 granted, bargained and sold all their title and interest in a certain tract or parcel of land lying on waters of Four-mile in Clark County, it being the same land whereon John Culbertson died, siezed and possessed, it being the said Joseph E. Brockman and Mary Jane his wife(late Mary Jane Culbertson) one fourth part of said land. Deed signed by Joseph E. Brockman and Mary J. Brockman.

Be it remembered that I, Joseph Embree of Clark County and State of Kentucky have this day consented and doeth hereby agree to dispose of my estate both real and personal in the following manner, to wit: In the first place I reserve to myself two negroes known by name of Benjamin and Lucy and also the money I now hold in my possession which is about \$190. In the first place I give to my son JOSEPH EMBREE one hundred and ten pounds to be paid out of the proceeds of my estate when sold which shall be hereafter expressed in this gift. Also one mare and saddle and bridle that is now called his for him; now to hold the fee simple title of the balance and whole of my estate I give to my eight children and three grandchildren the three grandchildren to draw only one equal share (to wit) Mildred Rawlings, Ambrose Embree and Lucy Embree, one share to be equally divided between them which will be one ninth part. I give to my trusty friend David Hampton for the use of my daughter Nancy Morten and her lawful issue begotten of her body and to be applied to her use and benefit for and during her natural life and the balance if any of the lot left to the management of the said David Hampton who is hereby appointed my trustee, to be paid over to her the said Nancy's heirs aforesaid. I give to my son Thomas Embree one ninth part; I give to my son Caleb Embree one ninth part. I give to my daughter Polly Jackson one ninth part. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Brockman one ninth part. I give to my son Joseph Embree one ninth part exclusive of what is given to him in the foregoing part of this written instruction for him to receive as soon as he becomes twenty one years of age, the whole of the portion that is given my son Joseph aforesaid, except the ___ executor to be drawn by and the management thereof I rest in the hand of David Hampton who I hereby appoint as trustee for him until he becomes 21 years of age and then to be paid over to him my said son Joseph aforesaid and so soon as my trustee aforesaid receives the money or property as the case may be to put the same and the usury paid over to my said son before he is 21 years of age or after at the discretion of my trustee aforesaid. I now do reserve to myself one bed and furniture, sugar desk and perhaps some other small articles for my use and at my death to be sold with the two negroes that I have before reserved to myself and the money arising from the sale to be equally divided between my children aforesaid. In this gift I reserve the whole of the negroes to remain on the farm until the first of October next and then to be sold with the land and farm I now live on. My negroes to be sold and divided amongst my aforesaid children, the land and balance of my chattels to be sold at public auction and at nine or twelve months credit my household and stock of every description to be sold as soon as convenient at not less than six months credit excepting what I have reserved to myself for life and as much as will be necessary to cultivate and tend the farm until the time afore mentioned with provisions and farming essentials. Given to my hand and seal this 15th day of July 1818.

Great Great grandfather John Brockman died in Orange Co., Va. in 1824. Will was probated in Orange County, Dec. 27, 1824. His will mentions his wife and following children: Oswald, Asa, Jacob, Stephen, Molly, Rebecca, Samuel, Elijah, John, Thomas and Eleanor.

Great-grandfather Jacob Brockman, had three sons, Asa, Jacob and James Thomas. He married Jane Burrus and after his death she married Pleasant Matthews. She went to Boone County Missouri where she died 1880.

Grandfather James Thomas Brockman, married Frances B. Quisenberry, May 18, 1840. P. Matthews was his guardian at the time of his marriage

A note says: Fayette County court records show a John Brockman owning land there in 1781. No record of his will in Fayette County. I believe he is the John who died in Orange County, Va. and that the property descended to his son (Jacob) Have been told that this son lost his mind while still a young man, after his death his wife married a man named Matthews. She moved to Boone Co., Mo., died about 1880.
