John Claye, Knighted by Edward IV, at Battle of Tewksbury, May 1471.

Sir John Clay (1538-1632), great grandson of the above John Claye, coal baron of Wales; changed name to Clay. Knighted by Queen Elizabeth.

Captain John Clay, son of the above Sir John Clay, ancestor of the Virginia Clays, born about 1588, called the "Grenadier," came from England to Virginia in the ship "Treasurer" in 1613 and landed at Jamestown. He was in Powhattan County, then in Charles City County in 1624, and settled finally in Jamestown, Va. Received land for the transportation of 23 persons. Married in England Anne, who came to Virginia in the ship "Ann" in 1623. They had four children, of whom Charles was the youngest child.

Charles Clay, born 1638, of Henrico County, Va.; fought under Nathaniel Bacon in Bacon's Rebellion in 1673, and died 1686. He married Hannah Wilson, daughter of John Wilson of Henrico County. From him came a line of descendants destined to make history in the new nation. They had seven children, of whom Henry was fourth child.

Henry Clay, born about 1672, will probated Sept. 1760. He married about 1708, Mary Mitchell, born Jan. 1693, died 1777, daughter of William Mitchell of Chesterfield County, Va., and his wife Elizabeth, daughter of Hugh Innes. They had six children, of whom Henry was the second child.

Martha Filmer was the daughter of Major Henry Filmer, member of the House of Burgesses 1642. He was the son of Sir Edward Filmer and his wife Elizabeth Argall, the sister of Sir Samuel Argall, Governor of Va. (Of Royal Descent). Henry and Lucy (Green) Clay had 10 children, of whom Henry was the eldest child.

Dr. Henry Clay, born Cumberland County, Va., 1736; physician; moved to Chalotte County, Va., 1771, then to Bourbon County, Ky. 1787, where he died Jan. 17, 1820. He married 1754, Rachel Povall, born 1739, died 1820, daughter of Richard Povall.

(Richard Povall was the son of John Povall, born about 1685, will probated March 2, 1767; married about 1710, Elizabeth Woodson, daughter of Robert Woodson, Sr., born about 1660, died 1729, and his first wife, Sarah Lewis); GRANDSON OF JOHN WOODSON, WIFE CAME TO VIRGINIA IN 1619

Henry Clay, son of the above Dr. Henry and Rachel (Povall) Clay, born Cumberland County, Va., Sept. 14, 1779, died Bourbon County, Ky., Aug. 9, 1863; married Margaret Helm, born 1779, died May 18, 1854, daughter of Joseph Helm of Lincoln County, Ky.

(Larue-Helm) The first of this family fled during the persecution of the Huguenots in France to Holland, thence to America. He died during the voyage, leaving a widow, two sons and a daughter.

Abraham Larue, his son, the emigrant ancestor of this family, came to America in 1663. He died 1712. Married Feb. 9, 1892, Willie Kern, born Bourbon Co., Ky., June 29, 1869, died Versailles, Ky., May 13, 1967, daughter of Caleb Letton Kern, and Eleanor Branham Kern.

(Letton-Willett-Kern) Michael Letton, born about 1690, will probated April 21, 1759, married 1722, Grace (probably Hartley), who died after 1759. Caleb Letton, their son, born April 4, 1740, died 1819, married about 1762, Mary Willett, born Nov. 1, 1742, died July 29, 1811. Caleb Letton served in the War 1812. Mary Willett was the daughter of Edward Willett, born about 1700, married Mary, probably the daughter of Stephen Cawood of Charles Co., Maryland. Edward Willett was the son of Edward and Tabitha Willett, who married in Prince George Co., Maryland in 1685.

Michael Kern came to America from Germany before 1700. His son Michael was the father of George Kern of W. Va., who married 1808 in W. Va., Amonda Payne. They lived some years in Kentucky but he died in Tyler Co., W. Va. Their son, Michael Strother Kern, married July 30, 1838, the widow Charlotte Millicent Ann Letton Ayres, the daughter of Caleb Letton — as above. She was born Dec. 5, 1768 in Maryland, moved to Kentucky in 1795. She died March 10, 1852, and he died April 25, 1854.

Caleb Letton Kern, eldest son of the above latter marriage, born May 20, 1839, died Bourbon Co., Ky., Aug. 9, 1916; married June 1, 1864, Martha Eleanor Branham. They had six children:

Edwin Conway, born Worcester, England, about 1610, came to Virginia about 1640; was in Northampton County, Va., in 1642, clerk of that county; died Lancaster Co., Va., 1675. He married (1) about 1640, Martha Eltonhead, born in England, daughter of Richard Eltonhead of Lancashire, England and his wife Ann Sutton.

Eltonhead Conway, daughter of the above marriage, born England about 1646, married about 1662, Henry Thacker, born in Va., 1632; vestryman of Middlesex Parish, Va., 1664-1700; sheriff 1672. They had six children; Henry the eldest child.

Henry Thacker, Jr., born Aug. 10, 1663, died before 1714; High Sheriff of Middlesex County, Va., 1703, justice 1706. Married 1690, Elizabeth Payne born in Va., and died there May 22, 1714. She was the daughter of John and Ann (Walker) Payne. Ann Walker was the daughter of Lt. Col. John Walker Burgess of Warwick Co., Va., 1644, 46, 49. Lt. Col. and Councilor from Gloucester Co., Va., 1657-58. Henry Thacker, Jr., and Elizabeth Payne, had seven children, of whom Elizabeth Thacker was the eldest child.

Elizabeth Thacker, born Va., Dec. 3, 1694, died there Jan. 12, 1732; married June 9, 1712, John Vivian, Jr., bapt. Middlesex Co., Va., Aug. 28, 1681, died there Feb. 12, 1721, the son of John and Margaret (Smith) Vivian.

John Vivian III, son of the above marriage, born Middlesex Co., Va., Aug. 10, 1714, died Orange Co., Va., about 1790. He married Aug. 12, 1735, Jane Smith, born Middlesex Co., Va., Sept. 8, 1715, died Orange Co., Va., about 1790, the daughter of John and Ann Smith. They had twelve children, of whom Jane was the second child.

Jane Vivian, born Va., 1740, died Orange Co., Va., Feb. 25, 1783; married Feb. 23, 1762, William Crittenden Webb, born 1732, died Dec. 20, 1815; the son of John Crittenden and Mary (Singleton) Webb; grandson of William Webb, who was living in Spotsylvania Co., Va., 1747 and died in Orange Co., Va., 1783.

William Webb Branham, son of the above marriage, born Bourbon Co., Ky., May 14, 1803, died Bath Co., Ky., Oct. 13, 1878; married March 31, 1825, Sithey Hedges, born Bourbon Co., Ky., Feb. 21, 1808, died there May 9, 1875, the daughter of John and Catherine (Troutman) Hedges.

The above John Hedges, was the son of Joseph Hedges, born Maryland 1743, died Bourbon Co., Ky., 1804; married 1773, Sarah Biggs. Joseph Hedges (who served in the American Revolution), was the son of Charles Hedges, Ensign in the French and Indian Wars, born Dec. 21, 1712, died 1795, Frederick Co., Md. Charles Hedges married Mary Stille, Feb. 12, 1736. She was bapt. July 3, 1715, died Aug. 23, 1765. Charles Hedges was the son of Joseph Hedges, Salem Co., N.J., 1683, died Frederick Co., Md., 1732; married in New Jersey, in 1709, to Catherine Stalcop.

The above Catherine Troutman, who married the above John Hedges, was one of the eight children of George Peter Troutman, born Jan. 13, 1741, died Dec. 5, 1820, married in Maryland about 1763, Anna Maria Miller, born Dec. 10, 1740, died Jan. 13, 1819.
