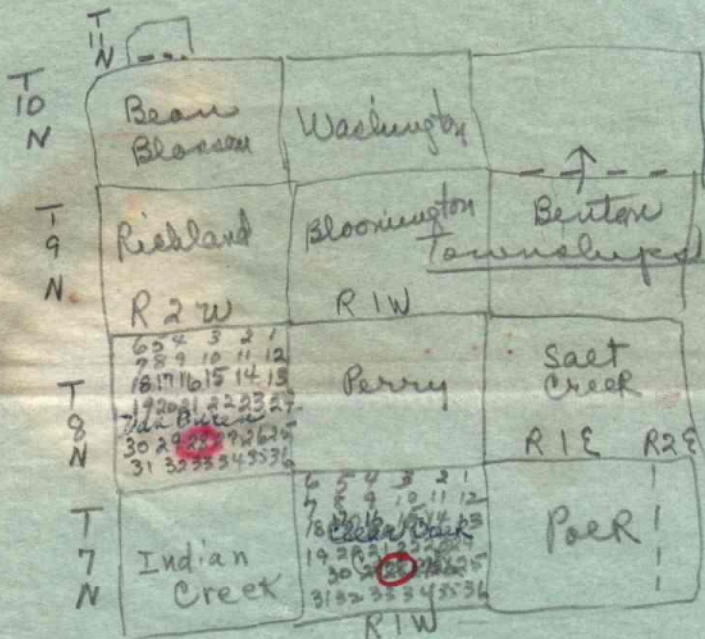

In her book, *Old Homes and Landmarks of Clark County, Kentucky*, Kathryn Owen relates that James W. Cole ^{engaged in trade} had several businesses. In 1838 he and his brother-in-law, Samuel J. Combs operated the "Cole and Combs" blacksmith shop. In 1841 his son-in-law, James Ballard was his partner in a grocery. He hauled freight from Winchester to Lexington. He was an inn keeper and a stock trader. In 1853 he was elected a trustee. (township trustee?)

Five of the eleven children of James W. and Elizabeth Angel (Palmer) Cole were born in a dwelling on North Main Street in Winchester which is known as "A House of Dreams". According to a great-granddaughter, Lucy Williams Hobbs, James and his son William had made a trip south to sell a drove of mules. James became seriously ill with yellow fever. Believing that he was near death, he sent his son home. Meanwhile his wife had dreamed that her son returned, riding a dark horse and leading his father's white one, to tell her that her husband was dead. When William came back under just those circumstances, Elizabeth sold her husband's business interests and the house and bought a farm on Muddy Creek Road about five miles from Winchester. Happily, James W. Cole recovered from the yellow fever and returned home. It is said that he did not blame his wife, thinking she had used good judgment in selling.

1-0 ISRAEL MEADOWS (*1756 Va. ? - 9/30/1827 Estill Co., Ky.) m. in Botetourt Co., Va. 7/8/1778 BARBARA GREENE (3/30/1755 - 8/?/1845 Estill Co., Ky.). They lived in Greenbrier Co., Va. during the Revolutionary War. In her application for a pension 1839, Barbara Meadows said that she was "born on Easter Day in the year of Braddock's Defeat" and that she had ten children of which Rebecca was the youngest. (Only the names of eight are known.) Israel Meadows served in the Revolutionary War as a Private in Capt. Matt Arbuckle's Company. He enlisted at Sweet Springs, Va. and was discharged at Point Pleasant, Va.

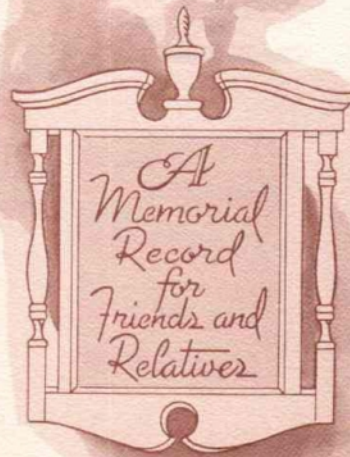
