Dear Cousin Kathryn, - Am afraid I cant tell you very much about our ancestors. should have written down things mother told me. But I was just like many others, thought I had plenty of time.

Mother loved to talk of her days in Kentucky. And I spent many happy hours evenings with her. I remember her often speaking of Aunt Sally Combs. but I just cant remember. I have a list of Mothers from Johnathan Ball, married Fannie Pitman had eight children, Jim, John, Will, (Brumfield, Tom (these two died in Union service) George, Willis Dick, Elizabeth, (no dates) George L. Ball married Lucy Cole, were five children. two sets of twin boys and a girl died in infancy. you no doubt have all these. will send a list of Mothers Great grand parents, on another paper. Mother often spoke of the Tavern, and will write what I can remember. Grandfather Cole went south with a drove of mules. (I believe) But they often drove hogs to market. I rather think was mules, took one of his sons with him Grandfather was gone for a long time, no word came back. Grandmother dreamed (or had a vision) that the son returned leading grandfathers horse. Was not long after the son did return, just as she had dreamed. Grandmother asked, "where is your father?" He replied, "He sent me back he has yellow fever and cant live long." I suppose he is gone by now. Grandmother sold the Tavern. moved to the farm and invested money in cattle or stock of some kind. was making quite a success financially. now I dont remember how long it was, but must been some time. when a man came to door and was grandfather. He had recovered. (almost from the grave) was quite a shock. But almost pleasant and happy one. He said she was a better manager than he was. So they stayed on

the farm, Grandfather was a Veterinarian, and Grandmother had studied medicine, understanding the care of the sick, was very good in cases of fever; Mother learned so much from her about caring for the sick, learned home remedies, and my mother was good in maternity cases, and went often out on these cases. For some time was about all the doctor Richfield had. Would now be classed as a quack, But most women did prefer her to a medical doctor with a degree. Mother never forgot to pray, and ask for the help of the Lord. Brother Jesse could been a doctor if he had the needed help. Our youngest girl took training, was a nurse, died with cancer. At the time was head of nurses in hospital. I have a picture of Aunt Kate Ball, and one of Aunt Annie Bradford with her son and Aunt Matto baby. James. is small - only bust of Aunt Kate Ball pin at neck and small pin on or shaped closing on dress. I have these here with me, one of Sadie Webb, Ernest Cole, Lizzie & Nett, Lady at <sup>piano</sup> ~~organ~~. Dillard Ware & family in yard, and J. B. Cox on saddle poney. I know there is others over at home in Mooreland, and will look through Lucy's pictures when I go home, Mother had two different pieces of Rebecca & Lucy, dressed in pretty summer dresses. And if you dont have any of these mentioned will be glad to send them to you. I am hoping to find some of Rebecca's letters also. Among our letters in storeroom at Mooreland. Rebecca's visit with us out on ranch in Colorado, was just too short, Mother did enjoy her visit, They sit in yard under trees, I could hear them talking and laughing. No doubt Rebecca told you, About coming to Springfield on mail car, and inquiring way on out to Frank Street's Ranch, And was told they had saw Frank in town. Locked

for him. You can imagine our surprise when they came in. And Rebecca told who she was. Such a surprise to all of us. And we did enjoy her visit. After her return to Kentucky, I did most of letter writing, and I hope ~~not~~ <sup>to</sup> find ~~for~~ letters out in Colo. I will find letters from her. Laura thinks most of mother's letters were left in a chest and she found doors open, mice had destroyed and damaged them. When one leaves home, the old things are not cared for as a rule. Jim & Laura brought what they could to their home here. Old home now is vacant. Laura and I plan on going back when weather gets better for a few days. Here on Ranch boys are so busy, and we hate to leave them with their meals to cook, are feeding over a thousand head of cattle now, and will feed until grass in spring.

The ~~man~~ <sup>estate</sup> that owns the pasture land, has quit a number of oil & gas wells here and are still drilling more. Men from Missouri have land leased, and Jim is over seer and works on a percentage, has some cattle of their own here. We lease out our Ranch in Colo.

Been so dry out there all fall and winter, from radio are having some moisture now. Here since in February we have had snow and cold weather plenty of moisture.

I try to keep busy at something am embroidering some pillow cases, don't do much crocheting any more. Have pieced and quilted a number of quilts since I came to stay with Lucy. was visiting her when she fell and broke her hip. never walked without a walker after wards, so I stayed nine years with her. I know will be so lonely when I

go back. will have to have someone with me. Although I have good neighbors, on all sides of our home. Moore is just a small town, but a busy one, lots of new homes being built. Close to 1000 population, good hospital, nursing home, good grade school and high school, several stores, churches, two laundries, one bank, several garages, and repair men. But is hard to get yard help, and our flowers and trees need someone to look after them.

Do you have a list of mother's family if not will send you what I have of her children and their descendants. is quite a list I have 40 great grandchildren & 3 great greats we had five of our own and 10 living grandchildren so is quite a list, I have pretty good health for a lady past 82 years, can do for myself pretty well. Laura does all the cooking, I set the table and help with dishes try to keep my own room. will have more to do when I get back to Mooreland, I must go through Lucy's things, and try to give them to the ones, she asked me to see they got, especially the gifts the nieces & nephews had gave her through the years. Lucy loved the young people, and was known as Aunt Lucy by young and old. seems every one knew her and loved her, always had a good word when speaking of people, especially kind and thoughtful to ones not so fortunate as others. You must be getting worn out with this, so will close for now give my regards to Cousin Lucy. I would like to see her. Mather talked so much of sister Matt and never wanted to visit Kentucky after her death would say Matt won't be there, and as each one went on. made her desire less go back.

It is my will that my wife Barbary Meadows have the whole tract of land for a home during her natural life, that is herein devised to John Horn and her life estate have preference over the inheritance to said Horn that is to say that said Horn have the same after her death and my request is that my said wife do not keep too much stock on the place. My will is that the tract of land that William Edens lives on in Estill County on Miller's Creek or a branch of said creek be devised to my grandson James W. Cole, to him and his heirs forever and I also leave to him my rifle gun. All the balance of my estate I give to my wife during her natural life and my wish is that she dispose of the same as she pleases except in the colt of my bald-faced mare with which she is now in foal, which colt I give to Sally Horn, and excepting also the first colt of the bay mare that John Horn is to give up to my estate, which first colt when it is foaled I give to Elizabeth Horn, and excepting my hoan which I give to my son Jacob B. Various origins have been assigned to the Coles, but Judge Redmond S. Cole of Tulsa, Oklahoma, who has made a nation-wide study of the family states that those from Pennsylvania, who originally spelled the name Kohl, went to the vicinity of Roanoke, Va., and later to Missouri and other places in the West, were an entirely different family from those who came to Woodford(Ky.) He could trace no relationship between the two families. Mrs. Ann Lindsay Grigson says in her book that the family is of English descent, and that Richard Cole came from Virginia to Kentucky and settled in Woodford. He came from Culpepper County, and is thought to have been a son of John Cole, whose will was probated there in 1757. One record indicates that Richard lived for several years in King George County, Virginia.

He came to what is now Franklin County, where in the summer of 1785 he assisted Humphrey Marshall in surveying the site of Frankfort. He afterward went to Woodford and settled in what is known as the Waits place on the Lexington-Leestown road, which was known for many years thereafter as "Cole's Road". Here he conducted a famous inn, "The Black Horse Tavern."

His first wife was Ann Hubbard, and he married second, Emsey James, in Woodford, 1795. The children of Richard (1729-1814) and Ann were:

1. John-married Nancy Hines and lived in Barren County
2. Richard, Jr.-(1763-1839) married Sally Yates and continued to operate the tavern after his father's death. His children were (a) Polly Finnie (b) Elizabeth Martin (c) Sallie Lewis (d) James who married his cousin, Sallie Lindsay, they had Zerelda and Jesse Richard (e) William Y. (f) Jesse. One Jesse F. 3. Jesse- married first Nancy Sparks. He owned several tracts of land on Elkhorn near the Scott County line, but went later to Ripley County, Indiana. His second wife was Mrs. Elizabeth (Roberts) Hyatt. He died 1857, leaving (a) Charles

The Coles are long-lived people, but Lucy died early leaving a daughter who was reared by her sister, Alice Lindsay. Jonathan Cropper married Polly Foster, in Scott Co.-1796.

The graves of Richard and Ann Cole and some of their descendants are in the burying ground at "Cole's Tavern".

Jesse Cole married Sally Chinn (dau. Ann) Green 1806; William Cole married Martha Bass (dau Joseph) Green 1806.

Dear Kathryn,

Thanks so much for your good letter of the 2d and especially for the clipping on Franklin P. Pendleton. I am so glad that it had a picture with it.

About the only thing I did in research last year was do about 60 or 70 hours work on census records in the Archives when I was in Washington, D. C. last October and November. I have 28 pages of extracts from the 1870 census of Clark Co (right now I only have 23 of them indexed to my files.) Also I got 23 pages of extracts from the 1880 census of Clark and haven't begun to index them. All of the 1890 census records burned I think they told me, or I'd have checked them too. I have some of the other adjoining counties for 1870 and 1880 but who knows when I'll get around to working on them.

I did work sporadically for about 3 months on Haggards after getting some real good stuff from Clinton Haggard in Rhode Island. I believe I really have about 60 % of the Haggards of Clark Co between 1800 & 1870 straightened out and know who they belong with. The census records are helping on that too.

Also I got a big block of names for the Wills Summary from a distant cousin in Cape Girardeau, Mo, a descendant of Richard & Eleanor (Patton) Wills. The list is up to 3,123 names now and will probably go up a bit farther when I get the census posted.

If Jack Hodgkin is genealogically inclined maybe he might have something on Samuel Hodgkin who was guardian of Eleanor Earl when she married James Rout in 1824. I have never determined her parentage and this Samuel Hodgkin is the only lead I have.

Are you having enough of your 500 family sheets printed so that you will have a copy for sale ?

No, I have never contacted Mrs Ewing. What lines is she working ?

In looking over the names you sent me for the Wills summary (descendants of Issac Piersall) I see that there are lots of dates missing. Do you have any which could be filled in?

The trouble I mentioned is only that Marilyn and I are involved in a divorce and it has kicked around much too long due to her vindictiveness. She left me in August 1963 and has been living in Battle Creek, Mich since that time. Hope to get it wound up by March.

Well so long for now. Hope to hear from you. Maybe I'll get on the ball more and do some better work this year.

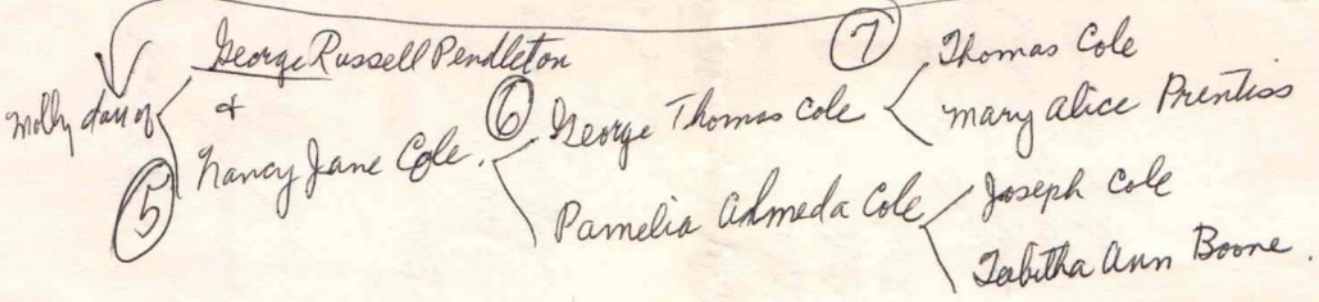
