I found in Kentucky material in Topeka Historical Library that a Rev. James Haggard (a Baptist minister) married Polly Haggard & Archibald Steele 26 Feb. 1820 in Christian Co. ~~Ky~~ Kentucky. In the 1830 Census of Sangamon Co. Ill. I find an old man in the Harmon Haggard household. In the probate records there I find that James Haggard died 2 Aug. 1835.

David Haggard called "Baldhead Davy", son of Rev. Henry Haggard was born in Albemarle Co., Va. 1767, married Millie Elkin-had 13 children: Polly, Lucy, Sally, Ezekiel E., Zachariah E., John F., Robert E., Nancy, Julia, Noah G., David J., Malissa M. and Elizabeth D.

Zachariah Haggard, son of David, born Clark County 1801, married Zilpa Hodge-had 13 children: One son Alvin B., married Croatia A. Stevenson (Alvin br. 1830)-children of Alvin B. Haggard were James, Nathaniel, Henry, David and Zachariah.

Letter to Dr. Doyle says there were 3 Nathaniel Haggards, the first married Elizabeth Gentry; the second married Elizabeth Hays; third married Elizabeth Bruce, who were parents of Cynthia Haggard Ramsey. According to dates the writer has there was no Nathaniel Haggard, son of Elizabeth Hays and Nathaniel Haggard. Writer is descended of all 3 Nathaniel Haggards.

Among descendants of David Haggard born 1763, son of Elizabeth Gentry Haggard is ex governor Routt of Colorado.

HAGGARD NOTES

Nathaniel Haggard was the son of James Haggard whose father was a wealthy aristocratic Lord of England. The Haggards of England all descended from Sir Edward Olgard, Knight of Bradenham Castle, County of Norfolk who came to England from Denmark and was naturalized (Henry VI 1433) He was a scion of a most distinguished family in Denmark

Dear Miss Owen,

Thank you for your nice letter. I am interested in finding the father and mother of the Nathaniel Haggard m. Elizabeth Gentry and went to Kentucky in 1788. And would really like to find out who ~~their~~ his grandfather was. From the research of mine that is enclosed I believe that it is almost certainly proved that his father was Anthony - but his name was Hoggatt in the father's will.

I have exhausted any information from Warwick Co. where James Haggard is said to be the father of Nathaniel. The old record books there have been burned and destroyed by the Wars and little is available.

The Hoggards in York Co. are so close in area to the Haggards and Hoggards of Warwick that I believe it is all the same family. And every Haggard/Hoggard/Haggatt/Hoggart family I find has a Nathaniel in it. The second son in my line in Princess Anne Co. has always been named Nathaniel. The Peter Hoggard who was a Nephew of my Thurmer is another clue to names. My Thurmer Hoggard's first name was his mother's maiden name.

If I can only connect my Thurmer H. to some of the other Virginia Haggards/ Hoggards etc.,

Do you suppose the tombstone of Nathaniel would show his parents?

I know the Gentry book and the Haggard book. The Haggard book is written by David Haggard and there was a David Hoggard on the Quit Rent Rolls of Accomac Co who was "living out of the Country in 1704"

If there is a will of Nathaniel who died in 1806 it might be wise to get it for me. Also - if anything can be found out about Rice Haggard who sold land to Samuel Wiles in 1816. The land was in Princess Anne County and ~~Samuel~~ Rice Haggard was in Cumberland Co, Kentucky. Thurmer Hoggard II, son of my first Thurmer witnessed the deed. So you see there is some connection between Kentucky and my Thurmer.

It might be wise if I wrote the Haggard families still living in Clark and Cumberland Counties, Kentucky. Would you have any way of obtaining their addresses or getting copies of anything they have that would help my research?

My Thurmer Hoggard died in 1779 - I do not know how old he was.

Anything you find that might be of help, I, of course want the source of the information. Reference or Record book #s & page #s.

I am enclosing a check in the amount of \$5. for any trouble you go to for me. I do not think there will be much help in the records you spoke of unless they show parents or brothers and sisters.

I will be looking forward to hearing from you.

Dear Kathryn:

Thank you for your very interesting and informative letter concerning the Haggard and Kindred families. I am enclosing two copies of information on the Kindreds, one for your personal file and one you may place at the Library if you wish. I may be able to send you more on the David Kindred line as I am supposed to receive a copy of it if my correspondent ever gets around to sending it. That line was established for DAR membership last year by a Mrs. Johnson in Portland, Oregon.

It seems Davie Kindred led a very adventurous and colorful life - being one of the first white settlers in 1844 to Washington Territory at "Tumwater in the Wilderness" - now Olympia, Wash. There is a monument erected there to him. His son contributed a valuable collection of Indian artifacts to the State Museum and Davie's picture hangs on the wall. I believe that he and Telitha left Ky. rather early, settling first in Missouri for a few years, and then going on to Washington. As you probably know the real settlement of Washington didn't get under way until about 1890 when the first railroad finally reached that part of the country, so you can imagine what a wilderness it must have been in 1844!

I was interested in the John Kindred and Drusilla Ramey marriage. I wonder if he was the son of William Kindred. If so, it must have been his second marriage as there is a marriage of John Kindred and Jamima Donaldson recorded in Madison County in 1789. However that was just too early for a son of William and Mary Kindred. Now I wonder who he was! Perhaps the date is in error.

I have never seen any children listed to Edward Kindred. Do you know if he had any children? I would imagine that the Elizabeth Kindred who married Benjamin Estill in 1834 might have been Edward's widow.

I was interested in the notes of the Providence Church. I remember passing it on the highway. Apparently we passed close to the old Haggard home, too. I'm sorry that we didn't have time to stop and hunt up these places when we were through there. Nathaniel and Elizabeth Haggard are said to have been buried near their home - "their graves marked only by creek stones". I would be glad to have a picture of the home - and also the graves if they are still marked "by creek stones". The Haggard History I have taken from the Kentucky Historical Magazine says they belonged to the Old Stone Church, which one of their sons founded. Perhaps they transferred from Providence Church to Old Stone Church. We got some good pictures of the latter. I am enclosing \$3.00 for the extra data you sent and to help in the expense of taking the picture.

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I am planning to establish this line to Nathaniel Haggard in my daughter's name (Marilyn Park) - as of course I am not eligible on the Park lineage, and have the papers about ready to go to the Registrar, but will have to wait until she is home this week-end to sign them. Perhaps later I will also establish it in the name of William Kindred (for an extra \$10.00)

I am also enclosing three sets of copies of Haggard information that has been sent to me. It might have some information in it you do not already have.

P.S. If you should happen to go to Madison County I would appreciate it if you would watch for a deed or probate of the estate of ALLEN PARK, father of Richard Park who married Nancy Kindred. The only document I have been able to get is his Inventory of Estate dated Nov. 4, 1806, Will Book A, Page 325.

I just can't understand why we haven't been able to find a deed to some land! He left Rowan County, North Carolina in 1797 and went to Ky. He was considered very well-to-do for those times in N.C. and occupied county positions of importance. His brother Ebenezer Park bought land on Station Camp Creek in what is now Estill County (400 A.) and later bought land on Drowning Creek where he lived and died.

Allen was in Ky. about 9 years and it does look like he would have had some land recorded in his name. Perhaps you could give me some idea where to look for it. We searched the deeds when we were there and didn't find any. Could it have been recorded elsewhere?

We know Allen was the father of Richard, but I would so like to have documentary proof. Richard lived just inside Madison County on the Madison County-Jackson County border (what is now the border)

If you have a copy of Mrs. Gum's Book on Ebenezer Park - don't put too much faith in its accuracy. She certainly messed up the Allen Park line. In fact I've found innumerable errors in her book. It certainly taught me a lesson - to have all my information documented!

Among Sir Henry's principal works were "King Solomon's Mines", and "Montezuma's Daughters" and "She", based on first hand observation in Africa where he went at 19 as Secretary to the Governor of Natal. He died in 1925.

Lady Haggard, the former Mariana Margitson, was married to Sir Henry in 1880.

Can't thank you enough for sending me the requested material. I realize that most county clerks cannot or will not look up early records - no spare time and besides, as you say, some documents are very difficult to read. However, I always hope that the clerk will refer the letter to someone like you. I'm most grateful for this favor and ~~will~~^{think} that I am most fortunate.

As you might have guessed, I am in the process of trying to prove my relationship to my many "ancestors." I would very much appreciate your assistance with this if you are willing. I will try to state clearly what I am looking for, then you can quote me a price for the different things.

I would so like to have a picture of the old home of Nathaniel Haggard and pictures of the cemeteries and stones of Haggards, Boyless, Strodes, Landers, Dawsons, gentrys etc. I received this from a Mrs. Cecil of Stockton, California, also a Haggard descendant through Nathaniel Jr. "Kentucky State Historical Society Record Volume 29," Nathaniel Haggard Sr. - Located on a farm now owned (1928) by W.E. Heflin on Howard Creek, 3 miles south of Winchester, Ky., about 200 yards northwest of the house known as the old Haggard home. - The original room built by Nathaniel in 1786 of hewn cherry and ash logs, is still standing in good repair (1926). - The graveyard had no enclosure and the graves are marked by creek stones." Have you ever seen this cemetery? On the pedigree chart I have written "dates" given to me by various people. I don't know whether they are correct or not. I have at least 3 death dates for Nathaniel Haggard "Sr." so it is all very confusing.

Would like the pictures of the Strode's stones. My records have John Strode (husband of Mary (Molky) Boyle) dying in Bourbon Co., Ky. - and his will is recorded in your own Clark Co., Ky. Probably he owned property in several counties. Don't know what the law specified concerning probation of wills in the early days.

The reason I wanted the inventory and sale of John Boyle was because the heirs are listed by name. Perhaps, sometime, you could just find the names of these heirs and not try to copy the whole document. The list of names could be notarized or certified by the county clerk which would serve the same purpose as the complete instrument.

I wonder if Elizabeth Gentry Haggard (wife of Nathaniel Sr.) left a will. Also A Rev. Martin Dawson etc. It is my understanding that the Haggards, Dawsons & Gentrys intermarried frequently. the three families naming their children the same first names down through several generations which only complicates the deal. Anyway, any thing that can be found about the families would be of interest. Little personal things about how they lived etc., pictures, documents.

Do you know of any printed Kentucky County histories that are still available? Also, two other families in my line are Alexander and Arbuckle (and Ashcraft) they are found in Kentucky in the early days as well as in Virginia. ~~XXXXXX~~

~~Alexander married Betsy Arbuckle~~ One more thing, are any newspaper article & pictures available?

Your letter came this morning and Ken had just returned from his 16 hr shift (4 p.m. to 8 a.m.) and this gave me some thing to do while trying to keep quiet. I'm not sure I did though, I decided to use his typewriter in hopes the data would be clearer - I'm not a typist as you can see!

The Nathaniel Haggard + Elizabeth Gentry Haggard who are the grandparents of "Bald Carey" are the 3rd great grandparents of Ken. and it was to the old farm of theirs we visited the day we went to Clark Co.

I'm still in a quandry on the Millie Elkin data - finding that quote from the bond stating "millie is dau of Am + Mary Kinder" really has me confused - she was born 1777 and they married about 1780 so, she'd have to belong to one of them before they married. I've never seen any record of Mary (Sally) Haggard's marriage but many researchers seem to have about 1780 as marriage date. making her about 23. but wouldn't you think

the records would have listed her as
 Mary Haggard Elkin? Wm was in the
 Revolution as a single man according
 to one record I read. Then to have
 the will of Robert Elkin so definitely state
 "my dau Milly Elkin, now Milly Haggard" really
 flows me. I'm wondering if they could
 have given Millie (or milly) to Wm + Mary as
 Elkins had such a large family - we only
 know of 8 kindred children, there could
 have been more of course. However we
 felt both of them married older than
 many.

I've underlined the 3 Haggard boys who
 had Elkin as a middle name which
 makes me wonder if that wasn't Millie's
 true name - don't think anyone would name
 3 for an ex husband - even if deceased!
 Also the sisters on her 10th one raises a question
 isn't that an odd name - sound Italian!!!
 Do you think such a thing could be that 2
 Millie Elkins' could have married Haggards
 and us be missing one? I could be
 content if only that kindred data wasn't
 so definite as her being the daughter -

Tells Of Article

To The Sun:

An interesting article on the Haggard family appears in the January issue of "Kentucky Ancestors," published by the Kentucky Historical Society. It states that Nathaniel Haggard, born in 1723, married Elizabeth Gentry, resided in Albemarle County, Virginia, and to the union were born seven sons and three daughters. Three of the sons became Baptist ministers and two of the daughters married Baptist clergymen. In 1788 the family moved to Clark County, Ky., and became members of the Providence Baptist Church.

The youngest son, Nathaniel Haggard Jr., who was born in Virginia (1765) married in 1797 Elizabeth Hayes, daughter of William and Charity Burgher Hayes, who also had migrated to Kentucky from Albemarle County in 1795. Charity was the daughter of Manus Burgher, and sister of Benjamin Burgher, Baptist minister.

The article referred to, "Genealogy of the William Haggards" was written by William Sandford Haggard, whose father had moved to Missouri with his nine-year-old son in 1851. It is quite extensive and deals with the author's experiences in the Civil War, and teaching, both before and after the conflict. He came to Winchester in 1862 to visit his uncle, David Haggard, and suffered an illness of several weeks from typhoid fever. After recovery, he joined with several Clark County men as teamsters under Shepherd Haggard as wagonmaster in General Bragg's famed train of four thousand wagons.

At war's end William Sandford again came to Winchester for several weeks before returning to Missouri. He resumed teaching and was married to Nannie Patience Bradley in 1783. He died and was buried at Mexico, Missouri in 1921, survived by his widow and seven children. William Sandford Haggard was a grandson of Nathaniel Haggard Jr.
