(Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

The said John Martin, Senior who resided during the American Revolution at Fluvanna County, Virginia assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Second Lieutenant, Fluvanna County, Virginia Militia

My ancestors's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:

John Martin, Sr. assisted in establishing American Independence while acting in the capacity of Second Lieutenant with Fluvanna County Virginia Militia. He also made exploratory trips with Daniel Boone into Kentucky Territory and selected land in that part which later became Clark County, Kentucky.

John Martin - Fluvanna County Militia. Recommended as Second Lieutenant August 7, 1777.
